Trustee Morgan made a motion that the following recommendations pertaining to extension and/or correspondence be approved effective the Spring Semester 1970. A second was made to this motion by Trustee Sneed and passed by unanimous vote.

2. Non-resident fees be increased from \$8.00 to \$13.50 per semester hour.

3. Graded lessons be increased from  $37\frac{1}{2}$  cents to 75 cents per lesson.

4. Book rental be increased from \$2.00 to \$3.00 per book.

5. Course revision be increased from \$24.00 to \$50.00.

6. Maximum of \$500.00 for correspondence grading and/or extension be increased to a maximum of \$1,000.00.

Upon the recommendation of President Snow, Trustee Mitchell made a motion authorizing the establishment of studies leading to the following degrees: Master of Business Administration, Master of Science in Counseling, Master of Science in School Psychology, Master of Science in Biology, and Master of Arts in History. A second to this motion was made by Trustee Harper and passed by unanimous vote.

Trustee Mitchell made a motion that the revised 1969-70 budget as presented by Harold D. Eidson, Vice President for Financial and Fiscal Affairs, be approved. A second to this motion was made by Trustee Ahlf and passed by unanimous vote.

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A motion was made by Trustee Sneed, seconded by Trustee Harper, and passed by unanimous vote that any social fraternity or sorority presenting its charter and requesting approval be placed on probation for a minimum of eighteen months following initial approval by the Coordinator for Student Affairs.

There being no further business to come before the Board, the meeting was adjourned.
