The Board of Trustees, Arkansas State Teachers College, met in the President's office, Arkansas State Teachers College, at 2 P.M. Wednesday, May 14, 1947, pursuant to written notice of the meeting and its purposes as authorized by the Chairman. Trustees Cox, Johnston, Parham, Guthridge, Elton and Flanagin were present. Trustee Colvert was absent on account of illness. Governor Ben Laney was present for part of the meeting.

Mr. Cox, Chairman of the Board, announced that a quorum was present and directed that the minutes of the last meeting be read. The minutes were read and approved.

Mr. Cox then declared the Board of Trustees ready for items of old and new business.

President Irby reported that the college dairy had been listed for sale with Southern Realty Company, Conway, for a period of 120 days as of April 28, 1947, at a \$24,000.00 selling price, with commission to the salesman of 10 percent on the first \$10,000.00 received and 5 percent on the amount received above \$10,000.00. Trustee Guthridge made the motion that \$24,000.00 be accepted if and when offered. Trustee Elton seconded the motion which carried unanimously.

After a general discussion of the operation of the college book store following the change in management, August 15, 1947, Governor Laney suggested that sale prices be controlled by the college to protect students against exploitation. Trustee Johnston made a motion that a manager be employed at a salary not to exceed \$200.00 per calendar month and two (2) percent of net profits, that the college pay for additional labor, utilities and janitor service. Trustee Parham seconded the motion which carried unanimously.

President Irby reported that the erection of the Industrial Education Building, authorized at a previous meeting of the Board of Trustees, would begin as soon as the Comptroller's office made allocation of building funds.

No action was taken upon the request of certain students that a third year of offerings in Vocational Agriculture be added to the college curriculum, and without formal action, the college administrative officers and alumni officers were advised to set a date for Founders Day which would permit alumni and others to attend in larger numbers.

After a general discussion, no action was taken toward the purchase of Central College property.

Trustee Flanagin made the motion that an out-of-state fee be charged all non-resident students at a rate of \$75.00 per semester and \$25.00 for each summer term, and to be effective September 1, 1947 and thereafter. Trustee Parham seconded the motion which carried unanimously.

Chairman Cox read a letter from Jeff Farris addressed to President Irby setting up in detail his request for a budget for Health and Physical Education for 1947-48. Trustee Guthridge made the motion that the request be granted to the amount of \$17,000.00 and that taxes on gate receipts not be a charge against the budget. Trustee Elton seconded the motion which carried unanimously.

President Irby presented a request from the faculty and certain interested students that the college construct and maintain a college golf course, using a donation of \$700.00 from the senior class for part of construction costs and a contribution of \$350.00 from the faculty for part of operational costs for the first year of operation. Trustee Parham made a motion that the request be granted. Trustee Elton seconded the motion which carried unanimously.

Chairman Cox read a letter from T. C. Carlson, Secretary to the Board of Trustees, University of Arkansas, which requested that the college contribute to a fund to pay the cost of lawyers fees in a suit brought by the University to determine the legality of Act 62 of the last general assembly. Chairman Cox directed that additional information be secured about the total cost and presented to the Board of Trustees at a later meeting.

President Irby presented nominations as follows for faculty and other employees for the 1947-48 fiscal year, for the periods and at the salary indicated.

Trustee Guthridge made the motion that the nominations be accepted, and that President Irby be authorized to fill vacancies and to employ necessary additional personnel. Trustee Elton seconded the motion which carried unanimously.

Trustee Parham made the motion that Trustee Amis Guthridge be elected vice-chairman of the Board of Trustees to serve until his successor is duly appointed. Trustee Flanagin seconded the motion which carried uhanimously.

Trustee Guthridge made the motion that President Irby be commended for a successful college year. Trustee Elton seconded the motion which carried unanimously.

There being no further business, the Board adjourned until legally called into session again.
