The Board of Trustees of The Arkansas State Teachers College met in the President's office Thursday, August 21, 1958, pursuant to legal call of the meeting by the chairman. The following members were present: Dr. John W. Sneed, Jr., Chairman; Louie H. Polk, Vice-Chairman; Mrs. Rufus W. Morgan, Jr., Secretary; Sam E. Adkisson and Dr. Dee W. Halbrook. Absent: Harry S. Ashmore and Walter Priest. Silas D. Snow, President of the College met with the Board.

Chairman Sneed directed roll call and declared a quorum present and called the meeting into formal session.

Minutes of the last meeting of the Board were approved as read.

Chairman Sneed called for items of old or pending business.

A progress report was given on Minton Hall, the new dormitory for freshman men and the following change orders were unanimously approved by the Board:

In the janitor's closet on the first floor install a washing machine. The change order is necessary in order to get power into the closet.

Louvers to be installed in the doors of the mechanical equipment room to obtain better ventilation.

The proposed housing development for married students and faculty was discussed and action delayed for a later meeting.

There being no other items of old business, Chairman Sneed called for any new business to be acted upon at this meeting.

President Snow presented the resignation of Mrs. R. F. McKelvey, Co-Hostess in Bernard Hall, effective August 31, 1958 and upon the motion of Trustee Pokk, seconded by Trustee Halbrook the Board unanimously accepted her resignation.

President Snow recommended the election of the following personnel:

Mrs. Martha A Nemec, Co-Hostess in Bernard Hall, effective September 1, 1958, at a salary of \$150.00 per calendar month plus apartment and utilities and meals when meals are eaten in the college dining hall.

Dr. D. W. Blackburn, Professor of Economics and Head of the Department of Economics, Sociology and Business Education, effective September 1, 1958, at a salary of \$583.33 per calendar month.

Andre E. McNeil, Instructor of Economics, effective September 1, 1958, at a salary of \$416.66 per calendar month.

Miss Merle Lander, Teacher of Third Grade in Demonstration School, effective September 1, 1958 for nine months, at a salary of \$400.00 per calendar month.

Ralva R. Bass, Instructor of Mathematics and Physics, effective August 1, 1958, at a salary of \$458.33 per calendar month.

Mrs. Gene Hatfield, Instructor of Foreign Language, effective September 1, 1958, for nine months, at a salary of \$150.000 per calendar month.

Margaret Presley, Secretary in Registrar's Office, at a salary of \$135.00 per calendar month - temporary appointment July 10, 1958 through August 30, 1958.

Annual salary of Glenn Powers, Associate Professor of Physics, be \$6200.00 effective July 1, 1958.
