Trustee Mitchell made a motion seconded by Trustee Harper that the new women's dormitory be named the G. Y. Short Dormitory. The motion was unanimously passed by the Board.

The motion was made by Trustee Halbrook that hereafter no college owned building will be named for any living person. This motion was seconded by Trustee Mitchell and unanimously passed by the Board.

President Snow presented a progress report to the Board concerning the appropriation request and the state building fund program.

A motion by Trustee Mitchell, seconded by Trustee Harper stated that all students under twenty-one years of age are required to live on the campus in college owned residence halls so long as space is available. Exceptions will be made for local residents and commuters. Students who plan to live with near relatives must obtain approval from the College Director of Housing. The Board unanimously passed the motion.

President Snow recommended the election of the following personnel:

- 1. Mrs. Arthur Henze, transfer from Demonstration School teacher to Instructor of English, effective September 1, 1960, @ an annual salary of \$4200 for nine months.
- 2. Mr. Paul Pickhardt, part-time Instructor of Foreign Language, effective September 6, 1960, for a period of nine months, @ an annual salary of \$2160.
- 3. Mrs. Doris Sams, Teacher in Demonstration School, effective September 1, 1960, @ an annual salary of \$3300 for a period of nine months.
- 4. Mrs. Marian Lee Turner, Bookkeeper, effective September 27, 1960, @ an annual salary of \$1800.
- 5. Mrs. Geneva Hickmon, Cashier, effective September 26, 1960, @ an annual salary of \$2400.
- 6. Bob Dempsey, Assistant Purchasing Agent, effective September 1, 1960, @ an annual salary of \$3600.

Upon motion of Trustee Adkisson, seconded by Trustee Halbrook and unanimously passed by the Board the above listed personnel were elected.

President Snow introduced Mr. William Farris, chairman of the insurance agencies located in Conway. Mr. Farris recommended the conversion of the college insurance program from ninety percent blanket actual cash value coverage to one-hundred percent replacement cost coverage. Trustee Halbrook made a motion seconded by Trustee Harper that the recommendation of Mr. Farris be accepted. The motion was unanimously passed by the Board.

Business Manager Harold D. Eidson made a financial report to the Board.

There being no further business to come before the Board, the meeting was adjourned.
