Board member Compere was represented by proxy help by Mr. Smith. Absent: Andrews, Page. President McAlister and Architect George Wittenberg were also present.

The minutes of the last meeting read and approved.

Motion by Humphrey, seconded by Smith that H. L. McAlister be reelected president for 1938-39 at a salary of \$4000.00 per year. Motion carried.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1. It is recommended that the President be authorized to fill whatever vacancies there are in the list for which places have been left in the budget; to employ whatever additional helpers are needed for the summer school; and to employ whatever help is needed in the dormitories and dining hall, janitors in the buildings, firemen at the heat plant, laborers on the campus and farm, always keeping within the funds available.
- 2. That the President be authorized to work out with representatives of the State Vocational Board plans for Agriculture, Home Economics and Industrial Arts, same to be submitted at a later meeting.
- 3. That the President be authorized to work out with Mr. Matthews and Judge Harper plans for reimbursement on salaries of supervisors of Agriculture and Home Economics in Faulkner County.
- 4. That contracts be approved with the Conway School District for practice teaching - the District to pay the College \$1800.00 per year.
- 5. That room and board be listed by the calendar month instead of by the school month and that the charges for next year be \$24.00 and \$25.00 per month \$7.00 and \$8.00 for room rent and \$17.00 for board.

That rent for rooms in the Apartment Dormitory be \$19.00 for a single apartment and \$32.00 for a double apartment.

- 6. That an examination and hospitalization fee of \$1.50 per semester and 50¢ for each term in summer session be charged all students, to cover:
 - Cost of physical examination by a physician at least once each year.
 - Hospitalization, which will include room and board and general nursing and expense of the operating room for emergency operations, for one week.

This is necessary on account of the new regulations passed this year by the American Association of Teachers Colleges.

7. That the President be authorized to enter into contract with the Faulkner County Hospital for the hospital services mentioned above.

An explanation by President McAlister was made of the meeting with the Board of the Reconstruction Finance Corporation in Washington on March 1 with reference to reducing the interest on RFC Bonds from $5\frac{1}{2}$ percent to 4 percent.

Motionby Smith, seconded by Laney that the expenses incurred by Attorneys Wheatley and Williamson be paid. Motion carried.

Motion by Humphrey, seconded by Smith that the Board of Trustees approve the appointment by the President of a board to raise funds for a portrait of Miss Waldran to be placed in the chapel. The Board is as follows:

Motion by Laney, seconded by Humphrey that upon recommendation of President McAlister the following leaves and appointments for the summer school faculty be approved:

Dr. Granville D. Davis be employed the first summer term

at a salary of \$150.00.
Miss Grace Cunningham be employed for the first summer term at a salary of \$125.00

Motion carried.

Motion by Humphrey, seconded by Smith that the State Forestry Commission be granted permission to extend telephone lines from their look-out station near Conway to their office on the campus, the President and Secretary authorized to sign lease for such right of way. Motion carried.

President McAlister made a report on the provisions made for the summer school at Harrison, Arkansas.

Motion by Humphrey, seconded by Laney that the Board reaffirm its former action with reference to PWA program for dining hall and kitchen, a new dormitory, heat plant and other building. Motion carried.

Motion by Humphrey, seconded by Smith that Chairman T. H. Alford be elected to succeed Mr. W. E. Phipps as a member of the Building Committee. Motion carried.

Motion by Humphrey, seconded by Smith that travel out of the state made by members of the staff under the direction of President McAlister be approved. Motion carried.

Motion by Humphrey, seconded by Smith that in the future the Board meet in regular quarterly meetings - the first Tuesday in September, December, March and June, the next regular meeting being the first Tuesday in September. Motion carried.

Motion by Humphrey, seconded by Smith that the Athletic Committee of the College be instructed to investigate the advisability of constructing permanent bleachers to seat 3000 on the athletic field and to install lights for night games of athletics. That the Building Committee of the Board be given authority to pass upon and make the necessary financial arrangements for such installation, if in their opinion it is advisable. Motion carried.

President McAlister explained the situation with regard to W. L. Gulledge who has been superintendent of buildings and grounds up to the first of March. Without formal action from the Board, but by personal expression from each member of the Board, President McAlister is authorized to give Mr. Gulledge another chance and the Board will back him in whatever action is taken.

The Board adjourned subject to the call of the Chairman.
