

Little Rock, Arkansas.

April 14, 1925.

On this, the 14th day of April 1925, the Board of Directors of the Arkansas State Normal School met, pursuant to adjournment, in the office of A. B. Hill, Little Rock, Arkansas, with the following members present:

Hill, Frauenthal, Dunaway, Lenon, Morton and Sloan.

Others present were Messrs. Milum, Carson, Adams, McAlister, Lieb, Bearden, Boyd and B. W. Torreyson.

B. W. Torreyson discussed the legislative Act authorizing the location of a Summer School in North Central Arkansas for 1925 and 1926, and recommended to the Board in his opinion the location of such a school at either Yellville or Mountain Home would be satisfactory.

Mr. Carson spoke in behalf of Yellville, offering free use of High School - 7 rooms and Auditorium - free ice water, Board \$25.00 per term, or \$4.00 per week, within two blocks to one mile of school building and stated that the building was located half way between Summit and Yellville.

Morton of Mountain Home asked that the School be established at Mountain Home, offering free use of Public School Building - 6 rooms, library, etc.- an 8 room Mountain Home College, 10 acre campus, dormitory, etc., library with 300 volumes. Also satisfactory board could be secured from \$3.50 to \$4.50 per week. Free janitor service, free ice water, etc.

Mr. Lieb also spoke in favor of Mountain Home.

Mr. Milum urged that Yellville would be more convenient.

However, after a general discussion by the Board members, upon motion duly made and seconded, the Board decided that the School should be located and conducted at Mountain Home in the Public School building of that town with the understanding that the School would have the privilege to accept such other accommodations as to building equipment in Mountain Home, as might be found necessary for the holding of said School and the proper caring of the students attending, with the understanding and condition that Mountain Home arrange to carry, free of charge from Cotter to Mountain Home, all students entering at the beginning of the term and returning to Cotter at the end of the term.
