1. Mission Statement

The primary mission of the Department of Leadership Studies is to identify and recruit competent individuals to assume leadership positions in education and affiliated organizations such as non-profits and governmental agencies. At the time of its formation (July 2006), the department's mission was to prepare individuals for entry level student services positions in post-secondary education (CSPA MS program), to prepare school leaders for positions of assistant principal and principal (SLMA MS program), and to prepare district level leaders for positions of superintendent and assistant superintendent (EDS program). In AY 2007-2008, the SLMA MS program's scope was broadened to prepare individuals for school-based leadership positions as curriculum administrators and program administrators for gifted/talented education and special education. Simultaneously, the MS in School Counseling was moved to the department, further strengthening the philosophy that school leadership was a collaborative endeavor that included other key professional positions. In January 2010, the mission of the department again expanded with the MS programs in Library Media and Instructional Technology moving to the department. Effective in AY2012-2013 the Educational Specialist degree was revised to provide for two tracks; a P-12 track for individuals interested in advanced study related to P-12 schools as well as leadership positions requiring a license and a post-secondary track for individuals interested in higher education administration. The mission of the department expanded again on July 1, 2015 when the PhD program in Interdisciplinary Studies returned to the department. With the return of the PhD program, the department now offers a full range of advanced degree program.

To accomplish its mission, the Department of Leadership Studies:

- •Seeks to find commonalities in the leadership roles in positions typically accepted by candidates who graduate from our programs.
- •Reviews all programs on an annual basis to ensure that curricular offerings and related experiences address emerging trends and meet professional standards.
- •Employs a competent faculty that stays active in research, service, and teaching methodology.
- •Provides financial support necessary for faculty to engage in service, research, and professional development.
- •Encourages collegiality among faculty, staff, and students.
- •Actively recruits students for all of its programs.

2. Status/Achievement of 2018 Goals

Goal 1: Maintain high quality programs for each degree and certificate programs. (COE Goals 1-4)

Action Plans

1a. Review each degree and certificate program to determine if curricular changes are necessary.

Expected Results: Identification of needed curricular changes that result in approval by SPAs, state agencies, and program faculty.

Actual Results: •Instructional Technology (ITEC) program completed a self-study that included the external review. The faculty began identifying potential changes to the program with final decisions to be made during AY2018-2019.

- •Library Media (LIBM) program completed the SPA report and received a positive review, continuing the program as National Recognized. In addition, LIBM began developing programmatic changes that will keep the program aligned with new standards from the SPA (ALA/AASLA) that become effective in ???. These changes were approved by the department, College Curriculum Committee, and PEC. These changes should go before the Graduate Council in September 2018.
- •The school and district leadership programs completed their SPA reports. Both programs will need to resubmit reports to continue National Recognition. In addition, new state standards have been approved that will require these programs to complete a thorough review of the curriculum and make changes that address these new standards. This work will begin during AY2018-2019. Language changes were made in the PMC programs that clarified the number of hours that candidates are required to complete based upon individual situations. These changes also addressed issues raised by Student Financial regarding eligibility for federal financial aid.
- •School counseling (SCCN) program faculty completed an in-depth review of the program. Based upon this review, the faculty recommended three changes: reduce the Add-on licensure track to 45 hours from 48 hours, combine two courses (SCCN 6320 Foundations and SCCN 6350 Developmental Counseling) into one course, a revised version of SCCN 6320 that will be renumbered to SCCN 6322, created a new course for students that enter the Initial Licensure track (SCCN 632x), and developed a new course (SCCN 63xx) to replace ASTL 6315 to more completely address the standard requiring a life span development component in the curriculum. (It should be noted that enrollment in ASTL 6315 is over 75% student counseling students.) The changes were approved by

the department, College Curriculum Committee, and PEC. These changes should go before the Graduate Council in September 2018.

- •The College Student Personnel Program (CSPA) implemented two new courses that resulted from curricular decisions made in Ay2017-2107, Career Advising in Higher Education and Finance in Higher Education.
- •The PhD program completed its initial 10 year review. The report from the external reviewers was received in late May, and the program and institutional response is to be submitted to ADHE by early July, 2018.
- •All non-PhD programs developed new admission standards that addressed new policies implemented by the Graduate School.
- •All non-accredited programs began discussions with the University Assessment Office regarding revisions of assessment criteria and documents.

Goal 2: Refine program level data regarding student diversity, retention, graduation, and employment information. (COE Goals 1-5)

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Action Plans

2a. Collect and analyze data regarding student diversity for both admission and graduation with a focus on student admission data from Summer 2014 through Spring 2016.

Expected Results: Data necessary to begin to analyze trends for both the program and the department regarding both admission and retention through graduation.

Actual Results: Data were analyzed for the time period of Summer 2014 through Fall 2015 using the Argos Dashboard for Retention created by IR for the department. During this time period, excluding the PhD program, the departmental programs admitted 340 students. Sixty of these students were listed as non-while in the data bases with 47 of these students identifying as Black/African American. The other 17 students were a combination of Asian, 2 or more races, Hispanic, and non-identified. In terms of admission, underrepresented groups comprised 17.6% of admitted students. With regard to retention and graduation (R&G), the overall R&G rate was 78.5%, and underrepresented subgroups R&G rate was 75%. A quick analysis was made for students entering Fall 2016 and their retention rate through Spring 2018 with emphasis on non-PhD programs. The overall retention rates was 75%. A quick analysis was done on non-PhD students entering Fall 2016 (N=92), the overall retention rate through Spring 2018 was 75%. Of these 92 students, 21.7% were minority (15 were Black/African American (16.37%), 4 were Hispanic and 1 Asian). Nineteen of these 20 students were retained, the exception being one Black/African American. The graduation rate for these students was not yet available as the data base had not been updated with that information.

In conjunction with the upcoming CAEP review, and working with the Associate Dean, departmental programs that are affected by the CAEP review have identified baseline data that will be used to determine goals related to CAEP's diversity goals.

Goal 3: Support appropriate faculty development for all faculty as appropriate to their career goals and role within the department. (COE Goal 6)

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Action Plans

3a. Provide an internal support system for new faculty and non-tenured faculty to assist them in successfully navigating the tenure and promotion process.

Expected Results: Retention of new faculty.

Actual Results: The department had one faculty seeking tenure and/or promotion during the current year. This person was notified in mid-May that her application for tenure and promotion to associate professor was successful. One faculty member did submit for mid-tenure review; however, that faculty member subsequently resigned in late spring to accept a position closer to home area. Two faculty member will submit for mid-tenure review in the upcoming academic year. Senior faculty and the department chair met with one of these faculty members to review the mid-tenure process as well as the substance of the documents that must be brought before the departmental committee. Three new faculty members were hired in spring for the upcoming academic year. Senior faculty in

those program areas volunteered and accepted the responsibility to mentor these new faculty members.

3b. Provide support and mentoring to adjunct and other non-permanent faculty assigned to various program areas.

Expected Results: Anticipated results include the following: smoother transitions into the respective roles of these individuals, continuation and perhaps enhancement of the instructional programs.

Actual Results: The department had two visiting faculty member during AY 2017-2018. The program coordinators assumed responsibility for mentoring these individuals. One visiting faculty member continued to receive high ratings from students for her teaching (she had previously taught as an adjunct), made several presentations including one at a national conference, and contributed to a curricular initiative. The other visiting faculty member had no previous experience with online teaching, and required significant amounts of time to adjust to this role. All of the non-PhD program coordinators were faced with extra ordinary responsibilities during the year because of the number of adjuncts that were required to deliver program. Overall, approximately 60% of courses were taught by adjuncts and/or visiting faculty. The impact of this heavy reliance upon non-permanent faculty did come at a cost, even though the instructional program with probably two exceptions did not experience major negative effects. The school counseling coordinator convened multiple meetings over the course of the academic year to work with the adjuncts to supervise practicum and internship students as well as delivery the required seminars. The net result was greater consistency in content of seminars and clarifications regarding critical experiences in internship and practicum. The school and district leadership programs now have identified several school/profession based adjuncts that have been inducted into their roles. These individuals provide quality instruction as well as the perspective from the practitioner and policy side that helps enrich the programs. CSPA, while using more adjuncts than wanted, adjusted to a late resignation and reassignment of another faculty member. Furthermore, the UCA President asked to be involved in the instructional program, and fills an important need as the program moves forward. Also, a former university legal counsel reengaged in the

program, and this has promise to be a long term commitment. Across all program areas, the goal is create a balance between use of adjuncts and full time faculty. CSPA is now close to reaching that goal. The other programs still need additional faculty before then can actually reach the intentional balance that is needed.

The PhD program has identified several faculty members from outside the department to teach core courses. The program did hire a second full time faculty for Ay2018-2019, but still relies too heavily on adjunct faculty.

3c. Provide financial resources necessary for all faculty members to be active in appropriate professional organizations and agencies.

Expected Results: The expectation that both the individual faculty members and the program areas, the department, and university will benefit from this engagement.

Actual Results: Every faculty member that requested financial support for involvement with appropriate professional organizations received this support. The department committed all of the summer incentive money to professional development, just under \$12,000. In addition, some faculty members applied for funds from CTE as well as other UCA sources to augment the departmental budget. Overall, the department, spent nearly \$14,000 to support faculty professional development. Three faculty members did not travel to national conferences; however, all faculty that are actively seeking either promotion and/or tenure did attend national conferences. Faculty engagement in scholarly and service endeavors to the professional at large, summarized in the appropriate appendices C and D.

5. Challenges

The major challenge facing the department is human resources. The PhD program, once again, functioned with one full time person, and continued to rely heavily on adjuncts for instructional and mentoring resources. That program did hire a second full time faculty member for Ay2018-2019, and this hire will alleviate some of the burden on the full time faculty. However, the program still needs additional committed resources, and ideally will begin to engage more fully members of the department. Other departmental programs also and understaffed. For the 3rd straight academic year, over 50% of three hour courses were taught by non-permanent faculty (overloads, visiting, adjuncts). For the current year, approximately 62.5% of courses were taught by non-permanent faculty. The school/district leadership programs and the school counseling programs are in greatest need of additional resources. Overall the long term effects of being significantly understaffed affects more than just the instructional program: faculty have less time to pursue serious scholarship opportunities and seek external funds via grants; significant amounts of time are spend inducting adjuncts into the programs; faculty are less inclined to actively pursue more significant roles in professional organizations.

A second major challenge facing the department is student recruitment. None of the departmental programs has a natural feeder. As such, faculty members are consistently reminded that recruitment is one of their obligations. Fortunately, many of our new students come upon the recommendation of former students and/or return for another graduate degree or license. We recruit state wide for most of our programs, and get more students from over 75 miles from campus that within 75miles. The CSPA program recruits nationally, and success is often determined by the types of assistantships available and these assistantships being competitive. All of our programs have competitors elsewhere in the state.

A third challenge is non-instructional resources for summer. Summers are critical times for student recruitment, and faculty are not always available to handle inquiries form students or to offer guidance to returning students.

6. Opportunities

The quality of the faculty represents the best opportunity. By and large, the faculty is highly dedicated to their individual programs and cooperative with each other. The senior faculty have a strong grasp of most of the factors that will directly impact programming in the near future. New faculty hires plus a new department chair will provide new perspectives for the department.

7. Summary

The current year has been challenging for the faculty and department. The increase in reliance upon non-permanent faculty took considerable energy from program coordinators. Several curricular review processes were completed as described earlier, Faculty productivity stayed in the acceptable range although a few faculty members reduced the amount of time dedicated to scholarship because the increase in use of non-permanent faculty and the need for curricular revisions. Enrollment stayed solid and retention remained constant. The arrival of the new department chair and the filling of two vacancies is a cause for optimism.
