#### SUMMARY OF GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

- 1. A minimum of 124 hours earned from the following areas: General Education 47 hours; Major courses 27-39 hours (depending on the overlap between the general education courses and major courses); Minor courses - 18-24 hours (minors must be outside the College of Business); Foreign Language Courses, as specified by the BA special degree requirements, and electives. A course may not be double counted in the major and in the minor.
- 2. No more than 30 hours may be taken in the College of Business Administration, and economics courses are considered to be College of Business Administration courses.
- 3. At least a 2.000 Grade Point Average is required overall, in the major, and in the minor.
