

Foreign Language (9 Hours)

Students must complete three hours in a foreign language on the 2000-level or above.

Minor (18 Hours)

SUMMARY OF GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

- 1. A minimum of 120 hours earned from the following areas
 - General Education 47 hours
 - Major 27 hours*
 - Foreign Language 9 hours*
 - Minor 18 hours*
 - Electives to equal 120 hours

A course may not be double counted in the major and in the minor.

A student needs 40 hours of upper division level credit (3000 – 4000 level courses).

*Note:

Major: 27 – 39 hours in the major may result, depending on the overlap between the general education courses and major courses.

Foreign language: A student with no previous experience in a foreign language normally will enroll in 1310. Students with prior experience in a language are strongly encouraged to take the departmental placement test before enrolling in their first course. Note: Guided Study (i.e., correspondence) courses will not be accepted as transfer credit in fulfillment of the foreign language requirement. Students who have not previously received undergraduate credit in a given foreign language at a college or university may receive credit by examination in that language. Such credit is limited to a maximum of six hours in one language or twelve hours within the department and is granted by fulfilling the following criteria:

- Achievement of a satisfactory score on a placement examination administered by the Department of World Languages, Literatures, and Cultures.
- Satisfactory completion, with a minimum grade of B, of the next foreign language course above the level for which credit by examination is to be awarded.
- In cases of unusually thorough preparation, or in the case of international students, exemption may be sought from the Department of World Languages, Literatures, and Cultures.

Minor: 18-24 hours, minor must be outside of the College of Business $% \left({{{\rm{D}}_{{\rm{B}}}} \right)$

- 2. No more than 30 hours may be taken in Business. Business courses are considered to be courses with the following prefixes: ACCT, FINA, INSU, MGMT, MIS, MKTG, QMTH.
- 3. At least a 2.000 Grade Point Average is required overall, in the major, and in the minor.
