The Graduate School at UCA is alive and doing well. We continue to be a major contributor to the growth of highly educated citizens in Arkansas, other states, and around the globe.

Graduate School

The Graduate School at UCA oversees 54 programs – 5 doctoral programs, 1 Educational Specialist program, 32 Masters programs, 7 post-Masters certificates, and 9 graduate certificates. Graduate student enrollment reached a headcount of 1,867 in Fall 2015. Our graduate students continue to produce a wide array of scholarship with many of them presenting at professional conferences. Students, with the mentoring of our faculty, produced 13 dissertations and 32 theses. This productivity is possible with the dedication of 400 UCA faculty and other highly qualified professionals who hold graduate faculty status. At the current time, we have 259 UCA faculty who hold Full graduate faculty status, 56 who hold Associate graduate faculty status, and 85 highly qualified professionals who hold Affiliated graduate faculty status.

The Graduate Council was actively engaged in reviewing curriculum, changes in admissions, retention and/or graduation requirements for a number of programs and concentrations.

University Research Council

University Research Council, a unit managed by the Graduate Dean, reviewed a wide range of proposals and allocated \$69,809 to support faculty research, artistic, or creative endeavors. Furthermore, an additional \$39,000 was allocated to support 13 summer stipends. Finally, students (graduate and undergraduate alike) had their research supported by URC, almost \$15,000 was allocated to underwrite students who presented at conferences or secured supplies for their research.

Sponsored Programs

Faculty at UCA have been highly productive in seeking and gaining external support for their research and scholarly endeavors. In the last fiscal year, there were 247 proposals submitted for support, and 202 were funded. Awards for the previous year totaled \$4,767,710. This amount was a decrease compared to the previous two years, partially due to the removal of funds that were received from and counted by the UCA Foundation.

The graduate faculty and students at UCA have been highly engaged in research, artistic, and creative endeavors and have an impressive amount of internal and external funding that has supported their work. The Graduate School and Sponsored Programs staffs will continue to encourage and support those efforts. A huge thank you is due to Patti Hornor and Beryline Temples for working so diligently to prepare this report.

GC Mission and Purposes

The Graduate School supports the vision, mission, and core values of the University of Central Arkansas. In doing so, the Graduate School

- Promotes intellectual excellence at the advanced levels of academic learning,
- Serves multiple communities through professional and training activities,
- Recruits and retains a highly qualified and diverse graduate student body, and
- Promotes integrity through ethical and responsible behavior in faculty, staff, and students.

The Graduate School supports doctoral, specialist, master's, and certificate programs of distinction in a variety of fields. These excellent programs help graduates acquire the knowledge, skills, and dispositions needed to become productive members of their chosen fields. The Graduate Council, a representative body of the graduate faculty, assists the Dean of the Graduate School in establishing policies and standards for graduate education.

In keeping with its mission, the Graduate School

- Approves curricula and admission, retention and completion standards for individual programs;
- Stimulates and supports creative, scholarly and research activity through the University Research Council and the Office of Sponsored Programs;
- Approves standards of appointment for members of the Graduate Faculty;
- Advocates for graduate education within the Division of Academic Affairs and other levels as appropriate; and
- Collaborates with individual graduate external programs and the UCA Director of Assessment to support program self-assessment and review.

GC Charge

As outlined in the UCA Faculty Handbook, the responsibilities of the Graduate Council include:

- a. To review and recommend to the Council of Deans new graduate curricula and programs proposed by the various departments and colleges.
- b. To review existing graduate offerings and make appropriate recommendations to the Council of Deans.

- c. To initiate and recommend policies relevant to graduate degree requirements, grading and credit policies, academic standards, and related matters.
- d. To review and recommend policies and criteria for graduate faculty status.
- e. To act as an academic appeal board for graduate students

- a. Graduate Dean (Chair)
- b. Department chairs are selected by the Faculty Senate, one from each of the colleges.

- c. Graduate faculty members with the rank of assistant professor or above are appointed by the Faculty Senate, one from each college.
 - Faculty appointed by the Senate included: Arijit Mukherjee, Biology; Janet Filer, Elementary, Literacy and Special Education; Mike Rosenow, History; Mark Spitzer, Writing; Alexander Chen, Management; and Letha Mosley, Occupational Therapy.
- d. Each college, according to the procedure for appointing college committees, appoints one faculty member.
 - College appointments were: R.B.Lenin, Mathematics; Michael Schaefer, English (Fall semester); Lori Leavell, English (Spring semester); Joan Simon, Psychology and Counseling; Mark McMurtrey, Management Information Systems; Rhonda McClellan, Leadership Studies; and Stephanie Vanderslice, Writing.
- e. One graduate student is selected by the Faculty Senate, one graduate student is selected by the Graduate Council, and one graduate student is selected by the Student Government Association.
 - Graduate student appointments were: Thomas Deatherage, Graduate Council appointee; and Mason Buerer, SGA appointee. There was no appointee from the Faculty Senate.
- f. Wendy Lucas was elected secretary by the Graduate Council.
- g. Drs. Terry James, Michael Schaefer, and R.B. Lenin served as subcommittee chairs.




Faculty Research

The goal of the University Research Council (URC) is to provide support to faculty members initiating a research project, artistic endeavor, or other form of creative activity within or among their disciplines. Faculty are encouraged to use research awards from the URC as seed money for long-term projects for which they will eventually seek outside funding; continuous funding of long term projects is not a goal of the URC. Although there is no established limit on the size of a request for funds, most awards are modest.

Award Stipulations

- The URC does not provide funds for faculty salaries.
- Funding for equipment will be made only in those circumstances where the equipment is an integral part of the proposed research and such equipment is not available on campus.
- Funding is not be provided for projects intended primarily for normal academic responsibilities in curriculum development or teaching activities.
- Funding is not be provided for the purpose of completing academic research toward a degree.
- Funding is not being provided for research initiated by a student, although student involvement in the faculty research is encouraged.





Funding is not provided for projects intended primarily for normal academic responsibilities in curriculum development or teaching activities.





Student Research

The goal of the Student Research Fund is to provide support to undergraduate and graduate students for expenses incurred in conducting and disseminating research and other scholarship or creative activities. The undergraduate student must have at least a 2.0 GPA and the graduate student a 3.0 GPA and be a registered student with the University of Central Arkansas for the semesters in which the project is to take place (students who graduate will not be able to access the funds after the date of their graduation). A student can receive **no more than one** award per academic year. Although there is no established limit on the size of a request for funds, most awards are modest. The maximum amount awarded from the Student Research Fund for Travel is \$400.00. Awarded amounts are determined by the merit of the proposal, the amount contributed by other sources (i.e., department, college), and on a first come, first served basis. The total contributing (matching) funds from all levels should equal approximately 50% of the total request. For example, if a department is willing to contribute \$200 and the college is willing to contribute \$200, the support from the Student Research Fund may be provided up to \$400.

Research Grant & Development Program (RGDP) Fund

Description

The fund is used to help faculty win a grant by providing matching funds to meet some grant agency requirements or to help faculty be successful with a grant proposal in other ways. The fund does not exist to be the primary support mechanism for an individual's research agenda. In consultation with the Provost/Executive Vice President and Dean of the Graduate School/Director Sponsored Programs may limit disbursement based on an individual's history of requests and disbursements. Each support activity must be connected to winning grants from external agencies.

Priorities

Highest Priority

Grant Matching Support

- 1. Help with grant proposals to agencies that require a match
- 2. Voluntary match or cost share when the agency has neither published nor implied matching requirements, but clearly a match would appear to leverage a grant award based on the agencies goals, guidelines, policies, and procedures.

Second Highest Priority

General Support

- Help faculty generate preliminary data to later develop a full proposal to a major agency.
- 2. Provide occasional grant-writing release time for promising faculty with particularly heavy teaching loads (must be done in consultation with chair and dean of the college).

Third Highest Priority

Infrastructure Support Help sponsored programs pay for internal SP resources that would help all faculty members win grants such as memberships, subscriptions, workshops and technology, travel to meet federal granting agents, grant submission systems, occasionally share cost in student development activities (e.g., SURF and student poster activities)

Students

Whenever possible, all salary and wages for graduate students working on sponsored programs should be requested from the agency in the form of direct costs. Tuition remission either in lieu

of wages or direct pay must be requested from the agency in the form of direct costs and be done in accordance with applicable OMB Circulars concerning salaries and wages. Students are not typically supported with this fund.

Project Significance

In order to meet unexpected institutional priorities, the Provost/Executive Vice President and the Dean of the Graduate school shall set priorities inside/outside this order dependent upon availability of funds and significance of the project to the success of the academic enterprise.


Budget Management


The Director of Sponsored Programs shall be the primary manager of this budget, and shall regularly supply the Provost and Dean of the Graduate School a balance sheet showing distribution of the funds and potential distribution of the funds.

Thresholds

After faculty members receive a cumulative total support of \$100,000, all years inclusive, project significance must play a major role in determining future support from the fund.

UCA RESEARCH GRANT & DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM (RGDP) FUND FY 2016








Sponsored Programs External Funds



- Collaborative Research Agreement







UCA SPONSORED PROGRAMS BY FUNCTIONAL AREA










TEN-YEAR FUNDING TRENDS BY COLLEGE, FISCAL YEARS 2007-2016





UCA Research Compliance


Research is the pathway to innovation in scientific and academic activities. In keeping with the core values of the University of Central Arkansas to maintain an atmosphere of intellectual excellence and integrity, the Office of Research Compliance provides support to faculty, students, and staff in their research endeavors. We work with faculty oversight committees to promote ethical and responsible conduct of research in the realms of human and animal subjects protections, conflicts of interest, intellectual property, and export control.

All members of the University community share responsibility for maintaining a climate of trust between scholars, researchers, and students, and between the academic community and the public. The Office of Research Compliance supports the Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee (IACUC) and the Institutional Review Board (IRB) to ensure that all institutional, state, and federal regulations are being followed, while at the same time developing a system wherein all UCA researchers have adequate tools, knowledge, and support to maintain the highest ethical and legal standards of research conduct.

Institutional Review Board (IRB)

All research activities involving human subjects conducted by faculty, staff, or students at the University of Central Arkansas are under the review and approval jurisdiction of the Institutional Review Board (IRB). This includes research development, preliminary investigation, pilot studies, testing and evaluation, interviews, observation, and surveys designed to contribute to generalizable knowledge.

In addition, all research involving University of Central Arkansas students, faculty, or staff conducted by an outside party is under the review and approval jurisdiction of UCA's IRB. It is the responsibility of the principal investigator to submit proposed research for approval in a timely manner and before recruiting subjects or collecting data.





The University of Central Arkansas has an Animal Welfare Assurance on file with the Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW), and, therefore, follows the *Public Health Service (PHS) Policy on the Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals*. The UCA IACUC uses an expedited review process when possible.
