New Program Proposal in PhD in Leadership Studies C.

The PhD program in Leadership Studies is based upon a scholar leader model that strives to develop scholars who are competent in their abilities to conduct independent, original, ethically sound research and to create, contribute, and apply theory with the intent of discipline expansion. Leadership studies is conceived as both a discipline and as an applied endeavor. Fields targeted for both recruitment and careers are education, government, health, and non-profit organizations. The program requires a minimum of 60 semester hours above an appropriate master's degree. Students complete a required core in leadership studies (21 hours), a required set of courses in research (15 semester hours), a combination of cognate studies and/or leadership electives (12 semester hours), and dissertation (12 hours).
