





Mrs Arteaga was the first Ecuadorian woman to hold the positions of Constitutional President and Vice President of Ecuador. She was former General Secretary of the Amazon Cooperation Treaty Organization, and Deputy Minister of Culture and Minister of Education. Until 2007 she served as a member of the Editorial Board of the Encyclopedia Britannica, and Regional Director of Fundación Natura. She is currently a member of the World Academy of Arts and Sciences. From 2007 until 2012 she was a member of the Steering Council of Agricultural Research and Higher Education Centre (CATIE) in Costa Rica. Arteaga is Chair of the Advisory Board of FIDAL Foundation and Executive President of A.S. Productions Cia. Ltda. Mrs Arteaga collaborates in publications in different countries and has written over a dozen books of her own. She is a lawyer, and holds a PHD in Jurisprudence and a BA in Political and Social Sciences, Journalism Studies and a master 's degree in Anthropology.

> Jim McKenzie Director, Metroplan United States



Jim McKenzie has been Executive Director of Metroplan, a council of local governments in central Arkansas since 1988. Metroplan is also the designated metropolitan planning organization for the Little Rock-North Little Rock region. Jim has a Master's degree in Public Administration from the University of Arkansas at Fayetteville, as well as a Bachelor's degree in Political Science. He serves as an emeritus member of the Board of Trustees for the Little Rock Regional Chamber of Commerce Leadership Greater little Rock program, was one of the early founders of the neighborhood movement in Little Rock and twice served on the Board of the Quapaw Quarter Association, the area's premier historic preservation group. Mr. McKenzie served a single term on the Pulaski County Quorum Court from 1983-84. Mr. McKenzie served on the Board of Directors of the Association of Metropolitan Planning Organizations (AMPO) twice. In 2000, Metroplan was awarded the AMPO Outstanding Achievement Award for MPO's over 200,000.

Ben is an animal lover and entrepreneur. He is the Founder of Ethical Animal Research, an innovative and humane animal testing company. Ben is also the Co-founder and serves as Board Director of 4Vets, Brazil's largest animal health distributor. 4Vets won numerous innovation competitions including Start-up Chile, The Latam Challenge, and has illustrious Venture Capital backers. Ben's first career was as a professional athlete, and in 2004 he Captained the US Olympic Team (K4) for Sprint Kayak and also trained competitively for cross-country skiing. Ben studied Bioengineering at Dartmouth College where he was inducted in the Dartmouth Hall of Fame (Wearer of the Green). Ben also studied Veterinary Medicine at the University of Pennsylvania School of Veterinary Medicine, and Health Care Management at The Wharton School of Business. Currently, Ben lives in Philadelphia with his wife, Christina, and daughter, Valentina, and they are expecting another baby very soon.

Courtway served in the Arkansas House of Representatives from 1995 to 2001. During his time representing District 45, he chaired the Revenue and Tax Committee. He worked in Washington D.C. as a legislative aide for U.S. Senators Dale Bumpers and David Pryor from 1979 to 1982 and from 1983 to 1986 respectively.
