Research and Culminating Experience Policies:

As a culminating experience in the graduate preparatory program (School Library Media Track), candidates must satisfactorily complete a program portfolio and present passing scores on the PRAXIS II – Library Media examination. The program portfolio must be submitted at least three weeks prior to graduation and must be formally presented to the LIBM faculty for approval. The PRAXIS II – Library Media examination should be taken at the earliest possible date during the semester planned for graduation. A score of 148 as set by the Arkansas Department of Education is the minimum required to pass the PRAXIS II – Library Media examination.

Licensure Information: (School Library Media Track)

The new curriculum map for the MS in Library Media and Information Technologies degree now allows a student who successfully complete the required 36 hours to be recommended for P-8 and 7-12 licensure without having to take additional classes.
