PROGRAM SUMMARY

The 5-year Ph.D. program leads to a degree in psychology. The goal of the 120-hour program is to train students to become qualified scientist-practitioners, working in settings such as community mental health centers, behavioral health hospitals, university counseling centers, universities, and private practice. The program guides students through a strong foundation in fundamental counseling skills and the appreciation of the scientific basis of psychology, especially empirically-based practice. Students are awarded both a master's degree (after two years) and a doctoral degree (after an additional three years). The fifth year is spent at an internship site in the community. A dissertation is required in the form of an independent research project. Students graduating from this program become skilled in a variety of empirically-based methods and practice, including counseling and therapy skills and assessment.

Frequently Asked Questions

How do I apply? First, applicants must apply to the Graduate School. The online application can be found at <http://uca.edu/graduateschool/admission-process/>. Can I become a Licensed Psychologist? All students will be eligible to be licensed as a psychologist through the Arkansas Psychology Board upon successful completion of the program and completion of all board requirements.
Is the program APA accredited? At this time, the Counseling Psychology program is in the process of applying for accreditation by the American Psychological Association.
How many hours may I transfer from another master's program? UCA does accept transfer credits. However, the amount of credits to be transferred will be determined on an individual basis.
What is your acceptance/attrition rate? We currently accept 19% of those students with completed applications; attrition rate has been low – only 5%.

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<p align="center">Admission Requirements</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ■ Completed, typed application form. ■ 12 successfully completed undergraduate semester hours in Psychology, including: Psychological Statistics, Abnormal Psychology, Tests and Measurements, and Research Methods. ■ Current resume or vita. ■ Statement of Research and Clinical Goals. ■ Three letters of recommendation – Letters should be from individuals familiar with your academic performance and potential for doctoral study. ■ Official copy of scores from Graduate Record Examination - must include Verbal and Quantitative scores of exam. ■ Official transcripts of all completed college coursework - Minimum undergraduate GPA of 3.25 recommended. 	<p align="center">You Should Apply If –</p> <p><i>You have: career goals that are compatible with those of the program; a clear understanding of the program goals and requirements; potential for successful completion; strong interpersonal skills; good oral and written communication skills; a commitment to social justice and contributing to the well-being of others; a willingness to work with persons from diverse backgrounds and not discriminate on the basis of race, gender, sexual orientation, gender identification, nationality, religion, age, disability and medical status; have clear-cut research interests and ability; strong interests in counseling and relationship issues, health and wellness, vocational psychology, social justice, and prevention.</i></p>		
<p align="center">How is Counseling Psychology Defined by the American Psychological Association?</p> <p>“Counseling psychologists help people recognize their strengths and resources to cope with their problems. Counseling psychologists do counseling/psychotherapy, teaching, and scientific research with individuals of all ages, families, and organizations (e.g., schools, hospitals, businesses). Counseling psychologists help people understand and take action on career and work problems. They pay attention to how problems and people differ across life stages. Counseling psychologists have great respect for the influence of differences among people (such as race, gender, sexual orientation, religion, disability status) on psychological well-being.
