## Student Success and Retention Council Meeting Minutes February 18, 2016

Dr. Winden Fey called the meeting to order at 3:05 pm

(January Meeting minutes were not approved due to lack of a quorum at the start of the meeting)

## Business:

- 1. Dr. Winden Fey introduced the new UCA Director of Assessment, Dr. Camille Shepherd.
  - Dr. Shepherd expressed her vision for developing UCA's assessment program.
- Dr. Baldwin discussed best practices and resources for helping students see a clear path to completion through the Guided Pathways to Success (GPS) initiative. Best practices include: whole programs of study, "meta majors" and informed choices, default pathways, milestone courses, intrusive, just-in-time advising and math alignment to majors.
  - Dr. Held inquired: (1) if the initiative is mandated or if it is voluntary like the AMAPS and; (2) how to include non-professional programs and other areas that are underrepresented in career advising. Discussion ensued.
  - Dr. Glenn outlined the process for implementing GPS: (1) include as a part of the Strategic Planning Task Force Report so money may be side aside for training; (2) have the milestone courses in place by fall 2017 and; (3) establish the meta majors and schedules based on AMAPS by fall 2019.

## Roundtable:

- 1. Ms. Lyons mentioned that staff in the Financial Aid office are receiving on-going training in an effort to better communicate with students.
- 2. Ms. Hall reported a failed IR Search for a statistician. The job description will be revised and reposted to better represent the position requirements.

- 3. Dr. Gallavan reported the College of Education is looking at ways to recruit more diverse students.
- Ms. Jackson mentioned the Campus Climate / Enrichment Survey was sent out today from the Office of Institutional Diversity to gather input from faculty & staff. The Slice of UCA is scheduled for February 24 and the BMAC Gentleman's Brunch is set for February 27.
- 5. Dr. Held reported plans to: (1) improve the social media presence of the UCA Core; (2) train FYE instructors and; (3) assess the effectiveness of the FYS.
- 6. Dr. Runge shared his idea to embark on a mission to learn of the challenges faced by black male students and to raise achievement for this population.
