MAT and MSIT meetings were coordinated for internship and practicum requirements - handbooks revised for field experiences to be inclusive of both programs; MAT and middle level students attend middle level conference and ACC conference; Delivered backpacks to Theodore Jones School; Switched the MAT practicum course to TESS and included a lesson observation by the mentor teacher, increasing public school collaboration; All faculty in the department and supervising in the public schools, strengthening partnerships.

5. Challenges

With increasing student enrollments in all programs and the addition of several new faculty members, our challenge is to continue to provide the highest quality programs for students while maintaining reasonable class size and faculty loads. Most faculty are supervising four interns as an overload in addition to teaching a full load. The move to online graduate programs has increased the amount of grading for faculty in courses and required some re-tooling for instructional strategies that are effective in an online format. Faculty have expressed interest in learning more about quality online instruction and investigating ways to build community and collaboration among the students since they have less face to face time to meet in groups. Along with the growth of our programs and the department, we are in need of more office and classroom space. We have outgrown our current surroundings and will have the challenge of deciding where new faculty will have office which may have to be outside our suite. Although larger number of students and faculty are a positive sign of growth and strength, they also bring with them the need for more resources including more administrative assistance, space, travel monies, and M and O.

Another challenge for our department will be the change of leadership in the dean's position. Completing six years under a strong, effective leader has allowed our programs to grow, our faculty productivity to increase significantly, and a positive morale in the department. With the recent announcement of our dean's retirement, faculty are concerned about the future of the college, the vision of our programs, and the educational leadership in our state and region.

6. Opportunities

Just as increased student enrollment, program growth and more faculty pose challenges, they also present opportunities. Our department has a dynamic group of faculty that are highly productive both in the classroom and in areas of relevant educational research. Opportunities for the next school year include:

- Implement highly effective programs with all curriculum changes required by Arkansas Department of Education and National accreditation bodies.

- Improve outreach programs to school age children in the community which would allow our teacher education students to impact student learning in the school through individualized tutoring and other learning programs.
- Become the best online instructors, including the latest research and techniques for online learning and building student online communities for our graduate programs.
- Continue research collaborations that result in some of the highest number of prestigious publications, professional presentations and grant opportunities.
- Provide leadership opportunities for our college and university through a unique faculty with excellent skills.
- Serve our students and community needs with professional student organizations, benefits and volunteer activities.

7. Summary

The past year has been an exciting year for the Teaching and Learning faculty. The evidence will show that this may be the most highly productive faculty in any department in our college in many years. All programs were revised and improved this past year and continue to sustain healthy enrollments in all classes. All faculty are supervising in the public schools, increasing the strength of our partnerships with the community. New faculty have been integrated into the group effectively, providing new ideas and generating lots of enthusiasm for our profession. A positive morale seems to permeate the department during this time. The future looks very bright for this department as this group is committed to making a positive impact on teacher education candidates and the K-12 population.
