Thought to have begun approximately 6,000 years ago, Chinese brush painting is one of the oldest continuing art traditions in the world. In this class, the instructor will introduce the art of brush painting. This brushwork style involves essentially the same techniques as Chinese calligraphy (also discussed & demonstrated in this course). Using a brush dipped in black or colored inks, students will first learn how to position their hands correctly to make the various stroke patterns required for <i>Flower-and-Bird Painting</i> : a genre which peaked during the Song Dynasty. This course will mainly focus on plant motifs such as bamboo: "one of the three durable plants in winter," and classical flowers. Along with learning the basic painting techniques, students will also learn how elements of Chinese history & culture are interwoven in this ancient art form. Beginning painters are welcome!
