#### MINUTES

The Council of Deans met in regular session at 9:00 a.m. on September 30, 2020 via Zoom. - 1. Welcome: Provost Poulter welcomed members and thanked Dr. Webster for her attendance.
- 2. Dr. Angela Webster, Associate VP for Institutional Diversity and Inclusion and Associate Professor of Leadership Studies: Dr. Webster shared many college collaborations taking place this academic year and a calendar of events. The diversity training topic this year is race and deans are encouraged to attend training. There will be a session on the black male experience on October 5th from 12:00 p.m. to 1:30 p.m.

    - i. Provost Updates: Provost Poulter shared the following information:
