Breadth Requirements:

Fine Arts and Humanities: Students must take at least one course in the Fine Arts (FA) and one in the Humanities (HUM) to fulfill lower-division (LD) requirements.

Social Science: All students are required to take six credits of social science. To complete the LD UCA Core in 38 credit hours, students should take, in addition to the Social Science course taken in the Critical Inquiry category, a Social Science course in either the Diversity in World Cultures or the Responsible Living category.
