¹ See appropriate choices, alternatives, or substitutions under "UCA Core" in the Undergraduate Bulletin. The student will also need to complete major, minor, or general elective courses designated as fulfilling the upper-division and capstone requirements of the UCA Core.

² Satisfies "Inquiry and Analysis: Fine Arts/Humanities" UCA Core requirement. This course or a World Literature course (ENGL 2305 or 2306) should be taken as "First Year Seminar."

³ Students with no previous experience with a foreign language may need to enroll in up to six hours of lower-level instruction to prepare for this requirement. These courses are not included in this plan of study.

The Academic Advising Center and the Department of World Languages, Literatures, and Cultures recommend that students complete the foreign language requirement as early as possible in their program in order not to lose fluency gained in high school.

⁴ Satisfies "Diversity in World Cultures" UCA Core requirement. This course or Film and Literature (ENGL 1355) should be taken as "First Year Seminar."

⁵ Course may be in any area. However, teaching candidates are strongly advised to take LING 4330 (Linguistics for Educators), WRTG 4305 (Contemporary Composition: Theory and Application) or WRTG 4340 (Teaching Creative Writing). These are 3-hour courses, so taking two of them may be possible for candidates, but would put them over the 120-hour threshold.

⁶ These courses require formal admission to Teacher Education program.
