WHAT CAN I DO WITH THIS MAJOR?

After graduating with a BSE in Physical Education and becoming a licensed teacher, you can work as a Physical Education/Health Teacher in the school setting for K-12. If you receive the Coaching Endorsement with our program, you will be able to coach any sport in a public school. You will also have the opportunity to take additional PRAXIS II content courses to add-on more areas of teaching to your license. Your career could lead to building level administration (vice-principals, principals, athletic directors, etc.) with a master's degree.

WHAT SKILLS & QUALIFICATIONS MIGHT I NEED?

Teaching requires a variety of important skills. You will need excellent communication skills to interact with peers, families, and students. You will need to be able to collaborate well with peers. Patience is important when working with children in the school setting. You will also need to be a great problem solver to make sure you can help all your students succeed. Management skills will also be important to make sure your classroom is organized and has the best teaching atmosphere possible.
