
WHAT NEEDS TO CHANGE

Eliminate requirements for competitor approval

- Arkansas Code 17-102-304 (a)(3)(A): Before any applicant shall be eligible for an examination, the applicant shall furnish satisfactory proof to the board that he or she [i]s of good moral character by filing with his or her application the affidavits of at least two (2) reputable acupuncturists who attest to his or her character
- None of our neighboring states have this rule
- Any law that requires competitors to approve each other is unnecessarily restrictive

Conduct a cost and benefit analysis of Arkansas's experience hours requirements and license renewal costs which are higher than average in our region

DEFINITION

Acupuncture means "the insertion, manipulation, and removal of needles from the body, and the use of other modalities and procedures at specific locations on the body, for the prevention, cure, or correction of a malady, illness, injury, pain, or other condition or disorder by controlling and regulating the flow and balance of energy and functioning of the patient to restore and maintain health."
