Arkansas has some of the most burdensome licensing rules in the USA. That raises prices and kills jobs. The Sunset Review process can change that by tailoring Arkansas's rules to Arkansas's needs.


WHAT NEEDS TO CHANGE

Delicense Sprinkler Fitters

 The Arkansas Contractors licensing board already requires a license for sprinkler contractors who are responsible for hiring sprinkler fitters. Other subcontractors have been delicensed and now only require registration. This should apply to sprinkler fitters as well.

If not delicensed, conduct a cost and benefit analysis of Arkansas's experience hours requirement which is higher than average in our region.

DEFINITION

Sprinkler Fitters are "qualified persons who oversee" the initial installation or servicing of fire protection sprinkler systems and who oversee corrections of deficiencies from an inspection." They also oversee Fire Sprinkler Apprentices.
