

2021 Virtual Mathematics Contest Registration Instructions

Before you begin, be sure you have a valid school email address.

You will need a Program ID for the contest you will participate in. These are the six options. (Note the difference between the number zero 0 and the letter 0.)

You will need an Access Code. This access code works for all contests.

To register for your contest:

- 1. Browse to https://mymathtest.com.
- 2. Look for the Register Now area and click on "Student".
- 3. Click on "Register for a course".
- 4. Enter your Program ID based off the above options. Click "Continue".
- 5. Create a new Pearson Account. (Or log in using your existing Pearson account if you have one.)
- 6. Enter your information.
 - a. Use your school email address.
 - b. Use the same email address as your username.
 - c. Enter your name and other questions.
 - d. Use a password you can remember later.
 - e. Answer other questions as indicated.
- 7. Enter the Access Code found above.
- 8. Finish your registration.

After you're finished, return to https://mymathtest.com.

- Login using your username and password. You may need to click on "Enter MyMathTest".
- You may need to enter your Program ID again, listed above.
- Look for a "Technology Demonstration" assignment under "Take a Test".
 - o It will be available starting on April 10th.
 - This will help learn how the MyMathTest system works. You can practice with question navigation and answer entry.
 - O You may need to allow pop-ups for the Pearson domains.
 - o If your computer can run the Tech Demo, it should also load the contest itself.
