# September 5, 1939

The Board of Trustees of the Arkanses State Teachers College met in regular quarterly meeting at the office of the President of the college at Conway, Arkansas at 10:00 a.m. Tuesday, September 5, 1939 with the following members present and voting:

Minutes of the meetings April 25, 1939 and May 22, 1939 read and approved.

Explanation of the refunding of McAlister Hall bonds was made. This refunding will be completed this week. Board member S. T. Smith was appointed by the Chairman of the Board to represent the Arkansas State Teachers College in conference with representatives of the Board of Trustees of the four other institutions (Jonesboro, Russellville, Monticello and Arkadelphia) to agree on the fee to be paid Judge Archer Wheatley and Lamar Williamson who acted as attorneys during this refunding.

President McAlister explained the contract with the Federal Government for room and board for the youth working on the NYA Resident Vocational Training Project. The college is to be the recipient of the labor of the youth and the Federal Government to pay \$17.50 per month to the college for room and board.

The students in attendance during the second semester 1938-39 petitioned the oard of Trustees to add the price of the Scroll (the college annual) to the regular fee paid by each individual student. Motion by Compere, seconded by Larey that the price of the Scroll which is \$4.00 per year be charged with the fees at registration time - \$2.00 each semester; that this charge be made against each regular student, but that it be optional with special students.

"BE IT RESOLVED by the <sup>B</sup>uilding Committee of the <sup>B</sup>oard of Trustees of the Arkansas State Teachers College, thereunto duly authorized by Resolution of said Board of Trustees that they hereby award the contract for the furniture for Girls' Dormitory and Dining Hall and <sup>C</sup>ommons Building for the Arkansas State Teachers College, Conway, Arkansas, to:

for the sum of NINE THOUSAND THREE HUNDRED SIXTY-THREE DOLLARS

AND TWENTY-EIGHT CENTS (\$9,363.28), which is their base bid less Alternate No. 1 of Group A, and that they hereby award the contract for the kitchen equipment to:

## KREBS BROTHERS SUPPLY COMPANY OF LITTLE ROCK, ARKANSAS

for the sum of SEVEN THOUSAND ONE HUNDRED THIRTY-SEVEN DOLLARS AND NINETY-SIX CENTS (\$7,137.96),

and that T. H. Alford, as Chairman, and J. Oscar Humphrey, as Secretary for and in behalf of the Board of Trustees of the Arkansas State Teachers College, enter into contracts for said work with the said concerns listed above, the same constituting part of the project designated as P.W.A. Docket No. Ark. 1238-F. These awards shall not be effective until the awardees shall have been notified in writing by the Chairman of the Board of Trustees of the Arkansas State Teachers College of such awards, authority for the giving of such notification being hereby conferred, and that Wittenberg and Delony, the Architects for the Board of Trustees, are authorized and directed to issue work orders to the awardees upon the satisfactory completion and delivery of the

Dr. H. L. Minton, Secretary of the Alumni Association, explained the provisions for the purchase of the pipe organ for the auditorium. This pipe organ to be purchased for \$8,000.00 - \$2,000.00 to be paid in cash and \$2,000.00 each year for three years. Payments to be made by the "lumni Association. Motion by Larey, seconded by Smith that the Board of Trustees approve the purchase of the pipe organ and that the President and Secretary of the Board of Trustees be authorized to sign as approved the Certificates of Indebtedness to be issued by the Alumni Association to the Company from whom the pipe organ was purchased.
