

February 7, 1929.


On this the 7th day of February 1929 the Board of Trustees for the Arkansas State Teachers College met in the office of State Superintendent of Public Instruction, Hon, J.P.Womack, in the State Capitol Building at Little Rock with the following members present and voting: Womack, Williams, Winham, Koonce, Humphries, Frauenthal.

Dr. Torreyson, Col. McAlister, Senator Hardy were also present.

President Torreyson made statement with regard to Senate Bill 179 by Senator Rankin, being a bill for the state to take over Henderson Brown College at Arkadelphia and make out of it another State Teachers College. After a general discussion of the matter a motion was made by Mr. Winham, seconded by Mr. Williams that the Board go on record as opposing the State taking over Henderson Brown College and operating it as another State Teachers College. Motion carried.

The Board adjourned subject to the call of its President.
