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III. MINUTES

Minutes of the May 26, 2022, board meeting and July 7, 2022, teleconference meeting, which can be found on UCA's website, were distributed to board members for review prior to the August 12, 2022, board meeting.

VII. ACTION AGENDA

A. Right-of-way and Easement to City of Conway

The City of Conway is continuing road construction and utility improvements on College Avenue as well as planning to construct a roundabout at the intersection of Farris Road and College Avenue. Conway Corporation is requesting on behalf of the city that the university grant an approximately 30-foot right-of-way and easement along the southern edge of College Avenue at various points between Western Avenue and Farris Road in order to move buried utilities necessary to facilitate the road construction project. The UCA Physical Plant has reviewed a map of the project, and a survey and additional drawings will be obtained prior to signing the easement.

Therefore, the president recommends to the Board of Trustees the following resolution:

“BE IT RESOLVED: That the Board of Trustees authorizes the administration to grant to the City of Conway the right-of-way and easement, and the president and other officials of the University of Central Arkansas, as the president may from time-to-time designate, are hereby authorized and directed to enter into and execute such documents, agreements and instruments as are necessary and required to grant the right-of-way and easement.”

B. Diversity; Diversity Advisory Committee – Board Policy No. 525

Board Policy No. 525 establishes the Diversity Advisory Committee in order to carry out the diversity language in the university mission statement.

Pursuant to the board policy, the Board of Trustees must make three appointments to the committee. They are as follows:

- One member of the university’s Board of Trustees; and
- Two persons, at least one of whom shall be a person holding an administrative position at the university.

Curtis Barnett and Shawanna Rodgers are the members whose appointments have expired, so the board must make two appointments at this time. Curtis Barnett was appointed in 2021 to a one-year term as the member of the board, and Shawanna Rodgers was appointed in 2020 to serve a two-year term. Robin Williamson was appointed in 2021 to serve a two-year term that does not expire until 2023.

Therefore, the president recommends to the Board of Trustees the following resolution:

“BE IT RESOLVED: That Amy Denton, a member of the Board of Trustees, is hereby appointed to serve for a one-year term and that Shawanna Rodgers is hereby re-appointed to serve for a two-year term (2022-24 academic years) on the Diversity Advisory Committee.”

C. Voluntary Employee Retirement Incentive

The administration is seeking approval of a Voluntary Employee Retirement Incentive (VERI) for employees who are 59 and a half (59.5) or older and have at least four years of total, full-time employment at the university as of December 31, 2022. Individuals with at least 28 years of service with UCA or the State of Arkansas are also eligible.

This plan will allow UCA to provide eligible faculty and staff with an attractive, completely voluntary retirement incentive, and it will allow leadership to plan strategically for the future.

Approximately 255 faculty and staff members who meet the criteria will be offered the opportunity to participate in the program. Those who elect to participate will receive a \$5,000 payout. In addition to this \$5,000, the employee will also receive 10% of their base salary as of December 31, 2022, along with 0.5% of their base salary for each year of service beyond the initial ten years, up to a maximum of 20% of the employee's base salary as of December 31, 2022. The program also offers each employee that participates a \$3,600 annual contribution into a health reimbursement arrangement (HRA) for four years, beginning the month following the effective retirement date.

Employees will have a 53-day election period to participate in the program. If approved by the Board, the election period will begin Friday, August 12, and will close at 4:30 p.m. on Monday, October 3, 2022.

Participating employees will have the option of retiring effective December 31, 2022, or May 15, 2023.

Therefore, the president recommends to the Board of Trustees the following resolution:

“BE IT RESOLVED: That the Board of Trustees hereby approves the Voluntary Employee Retirement Incentive plan described above, and that the president and such other officials of the University of Central Arkansas, as the president may from time-to-time designate, are hereby authorized and directed to enter into and execute such other documents, agreements, and instruments as are necessary and required to implement the retirement plan.”

D. Temporary Undergraduate Admission Criteria (Through Academic Year 2026/2027) – Board Policy No. 310

In our continued effort to respond to the needs of high school students from the effects of the pandemic and standardized testing impacts within their educational preparation, this proposal advocates for the continuation of the temporary admission policy that was put into place during spring 2020.

Over the last two years, disruptions to standardized tests, such as the ACT and SAT, have reduced the access for students in test offerings. While normalcy appears to be ahead of us, the educational journey of our high school students within the state has been disrupted by various methods of educational formats and readiness. Through the 2026/2027 academic year, we are requesting a continuance of our temporary policy that provides two options for admission to UCA. First, the use of our traditional undergraduate admission standard. The second option is based on high school grade point average (GPA). Based on an analysis of data, the administration has determined that a 3.0 high school GPA indicates strong potential for success at UCA for our incoming students.

The continuation of test-optional for the recruitment of students through the 2026/2027 academic year will allow UCA flexibility in our work with students who have faced a unique educational journey. For the fall 2020, this flexibility in admission standard resulted in admitting 237 students - 51 enrolled at UCA. During the fall 2021 term, this continued flexibility aided in 859 students being admitted to UCA - 214 enrolled in the 2021 first-year cohort.

The temporary policy will continue to allow students who are having access or retake issues with standardized tests the opportunity to be admitted to UCA based solely on their high school academic success.

The University Admissions Committee and all appropriate administrators have recommended approval of this continuation of the temporary Admissions Policy.

Therefore, the president recommends to the Board of Trustees the following resolution:

“BE IT RESOLVED: That the Board of Trustees approves the proposed temporary admission criteria through the 2026/2027 Academic Year.”

A. **Notification: Approval to Offer the Bachelor of Science in Health Promotion Online**

The Department of Health Sciences in the College of Health and Behavioral Sciences has requested approval to offer the Bachelor of Science (BS) program in Health Promotion online. Required courses in the major are all approved for online delivery as are a number of other courses required to complete the degree. ADHE rules require formal notification of any program that will offer 50% or more of the program curriculum online, and the BS in Health Promotion is now nearing that threshold.

Faculty and staff in the Department of Health Sciences are attentive to the increase in student preference for online courses over recent years. Courses in the Department of Health Sciences that are offered in an online format reach maximum enrollment first, followed by hybrid courses, and then traditional courses. When queried, students cite flexibility in scheduling and self-paced learning as advantages of online courses. The online course option is increasingly selected by non-traditional students as well as those who work either full or part time. Additionally, many of these students have family responsibilities that prevent enrollment in a more traditional, face-to-face course schedule.

As institutions of higher learning compete for a decreasing pool of high school graduates and individuals who desire to increase their career options, an online degree program can keep the Department of Health Sciences competitive with departments and institutions that offer career pathways via online programs. Two degree programs in the department are already delivered online—the BS program in Addiction Studies (online as a degree completion program) and the MS in Health Promotion (100% online). Increasingly, these programs are able to recruit and educate students from across the US and, in some cases, internationally. The flexibility to provide a fully online option for students would be expected to maintain or possibly boost enrollment.

This change means that departments with BA/BS program pairs may either (1) choose to retain one of the otherwise identical programs (BA or BS) based on program content and to delete the other or (2) justify retaining both degrees by demonstrating or developing differences between the two degree programs in curricular content, student learning outcomes, and student audience.

In response to these options, the Department of Philosophy and Religion in UCA’s College of Arts, Humanities, and Social Sciences, has chosen to delete the BA degree program in Philosophy and to retain the BS degree program in Philosophy. Doing so removes degree redundancy, simplifies the curricular terrain for students, and reduces miscommunication about the richness of UCA academic programming. The deletion also addresses the non-viability of the programs in Philosophy: while neither the BA nor the BS degrees in Philosophy is currently viable on its own, a single program will be viable if it maintains the enrollment and the completion record of the pair.

Students currently enrolled in the BA in Philosophy may choose to complete their current program or move to the BS program. All students currently enrolled in the BA program who wish to remain in the BA program are expected to have completed the degree by May 2025.

This change means that departments with BA/BS program pairs may either (1) choose to retain one of the otherwise identical programs (BA or BS) based on program content and to delete the other or (2) justify retaining both degrees by demonstrating or developing differences between the two degree programs in curricular content, student learning outcomes, and student audience.

In response to these options, the Department of Political Science in UCA’s College of Arts, Humanities, and Social Sciences, has chosen a third option: replace both the BA and the BS in Public Administration with a Bachelor of Public Administration (BPA) program. Doing so removes degree redundancy, simplifies the curricular terrain for students, gives additional name recognition to the Public Administration program, and reduces miscommunication about the richness of UCA academic programming. This change also addresses program viability risks (the BA program is not viable, and the BS program is just barely viable): combining the two as the BPA program will allow the single program to maintain viability and, we believe, grow. Notification of the creation of the BPA program was made to the Board of Trustees in May 2022; this deletion notification for the BA and BS programs takes the next step in making the replacement.

Students currently enrolled in the BA and BS programs in Public Administration may choose to complete their current program or move to the BPA. All students currently enrolled in the BA and BS programs who wish to remain in the BA and BS programs are expected to have completed by May 2024.
