Description of the events at UCA, October 13-14

The following list contains descriptions of what to expect at each event, including length of time the attendees should expect to be there:

Oct, 13, 6-7pm: *Planetary Dance for Healing*, Alumni Circle:

Event description: This is an hour long outdoor participatory dance and movement activity held in Alumni Circle at UCA. There will be participatory opportunities for sitting, standing, walking, and running in three concentric circles to the beat of drummers. Drum volume will vary throughout the activity.

WHAT TO KNOW BEFORE YOU GO

Location description: Alumni Circle is a grassy circle with two sidewalks running east to west with curb cuts. The sidewalks are stamped concrete and are raised slightly above surrounding ground level. The circle contains several shade trees, and chairs will be available for those needing to rest.



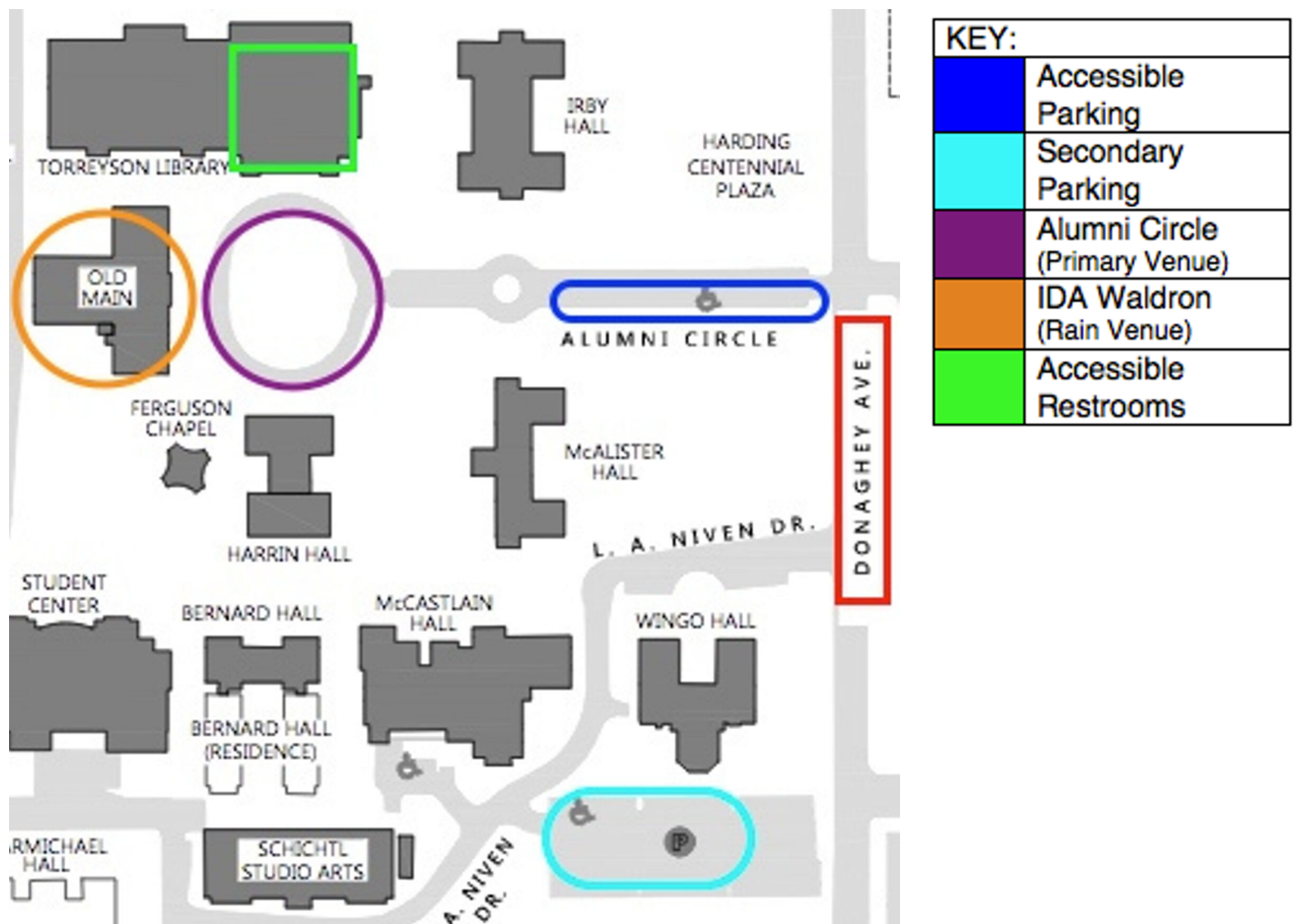
Event Parking: Accessible parking will be available on the road leading to Alumni Circle off of Donaghey Ave. Secondary parking will be available at Wingo Hall. Golf carts will be available for transport from parking to Alumni Circle.

Accessible Restrooms: Restrooms will be available in Torreyson Library North of Alumni Circle

WHAT TO KNOW BEFORE YOU GO

Oct, 14, 6-7pm: *If...a memoir*, Lawn outside McCastlain Hall

Event description: This is an hour long outdoor performance event comprised of movement and amplified spoken word by microphoned artists. Printed copies of the performed poem will be available. An audio sound score will accompany the performance and will vary in volume throughout. Work lights will light the performance and light levels may vary throughout the performance.

Location description: The lawn outside McCastlain Hall is a rectangular grassy area surrounded by sidewalks of stamped concrete raised slightly above the grassy area. Folding chairs and bleachers will be provided for seating.



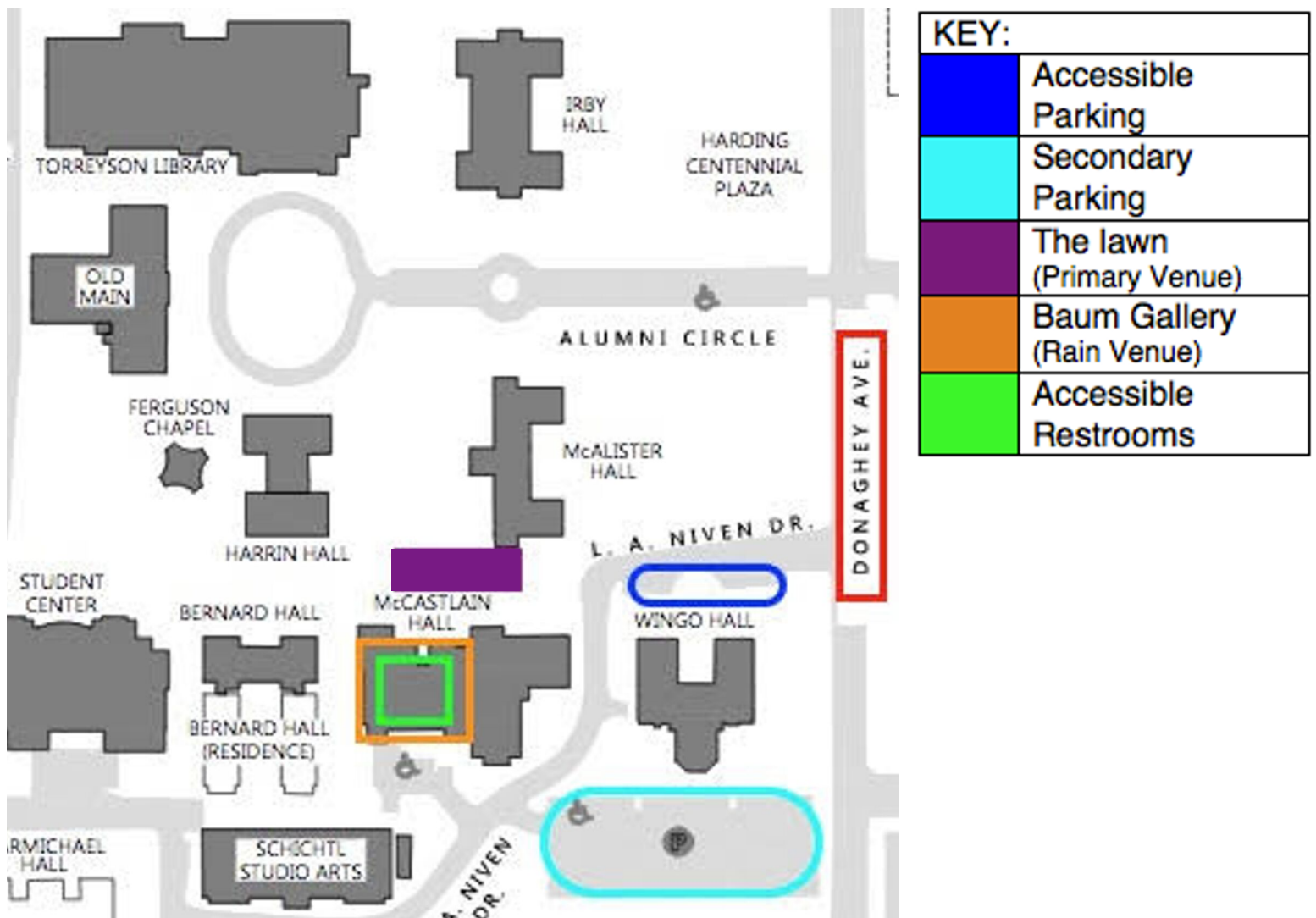
