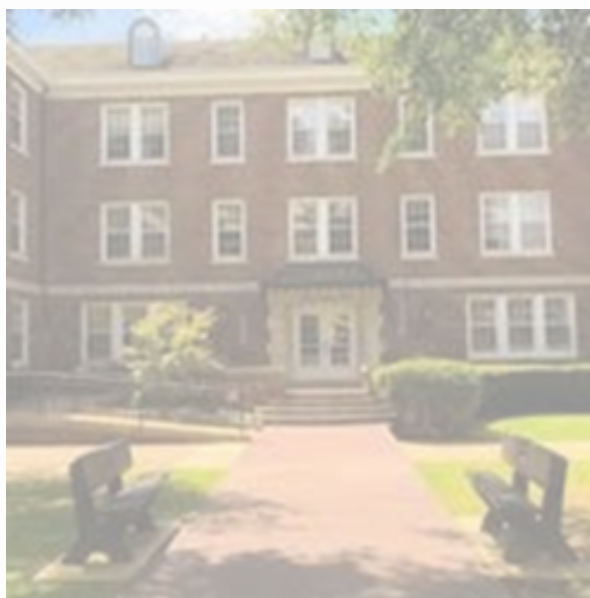

Offer advocacy for the adult learning community.

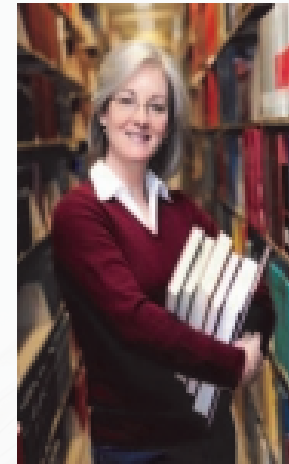
Offer networking with other nontraditional students and professionals in the field of higher education.
