The Student Support and Resource Center supports UCA students seeking assistance with unexpected financial difficulties. Our mission is to help students connect to campus and community resources when a temporary financial setback threatens their academic success. Any student facing a financial emergency is encouraged to set an appointment online, by phone or by stopping into the office.

NEED HELP? YOU'VE COME TO THE RIGHT PLACE!

General Eligibility:

- Current degree-seeking student
- Facing an unforeseen emergency situation or financial crisis
- Registered in the term for which assistance is requested
- Exhausted all other types of financial aid, including student loans
- Not owe a past-due balance
- Have a current FAFSA on file in the UCA Financial Aid Office

Requirements & Conditions:

- Attend a meeting with staff in the Student Support and Resource Center before applying, unless otherwise stated in an invitation or award letter
- Provide requested documentation of the financial emergency and/or expenses to be paid
- Total financial aid for the academic year must not exceed your cost of attendance

NOTE: Further requirements and conditions may apply for a specific scholarship or grant. Contact us, and we can work together to find the right solution for you!

AID PROGRAMS



Assistance Program for Student with Exceptional Circumstances (APSEC)

Scholarships of up to \$3,000 are available to students experiencing an extraordinary financial crisis that has left them without sufficient resources to remain at UCA.



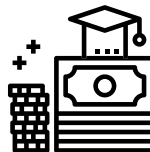
Emergency Textbook Grants

Grants of up to \$500 are available to assist students with the purchase of textbooks for UCA courses.



DASH Emergency Grants

Grants of up to \$1,000 are available to students facing unexpected but temporary financial setbacks related to the cost of non-university expenses such as auto repair, utilities, medical bills and more.



Emergency Grants pilot programs

We occasionally pilot new programs which provide grants to help students who are in extenuating circumstances work towards completing their degree.
