<p>Providing direct instruction</p>	<p>Live, synchronous instruction where both the instructor and the student are online and in communication at the same time. (2)</p>	<p>Recorded video lectures Optional live sessions</p>
<p>Assessing or providing feedback on a student’s coursework</p>	<p>Providing timely, individualized, and in-depth feedback on student work Scheduling zoom meetings to discuss the individual student’s progress in class Critique of a student’s work in progress Identifying students struggling to meet mastery and offering additional opportunities for interaction</p>	<p>Autograded assignments and quizzes Entering numeric grades to the gradebook Giving non-specific positive or negative feedback</p>
<p>Providing information or responding to questions about the content of a course or competency</p>	<p>Setting and following communication standards with a structured system for when and how student questions are addressed Asking a student to schedule a conference with you Offering regularly scheduled virtual office hours Regularly scheduling announcements with highlights, previews, focus questions, or goals for the week</p>	<p>Posting due date or attendance reminders Interactions initiated by the student Offering office hours by request Checking on a student's well-being</p>
<p>Facilitating a group discussion regarding the content of a course or competency</p>	<p>Actively responding to posts in a class discussion board, video discussion, or reading discussion Utilizing study groups that are moderated by the instructor Moderating peer feedback sessions Scheduling group tutoring sessions for additional support</p>	<p>Assigning student-to-student discussions or interactions Creating independent study groups Assigning peer feedback sessions</p>
