

UCA Debate and Forensics offers scholarships of up to \$1000 a semester to students to who plan to study communication and who demonstrated excellence in debate, forensics, or competitive speech.

UCA Debate and Forensics has had a recent history of success in debate and forensics. The team was recognized as the top Arkansas school at the Southern Forensics Championship from 2014-16 and in 2018. It is also nationally competitive in the International Public Debate Association (IPDA), ranking fifth for the 2017-18 season in Founder's Cup (recognizing overall team excellence) and fourth in the professional and Team IPDA Divisions. Members of the team also won the prestigious Madison Cup at James Madison University in April 2018, resulting in \$2000 scholarships for the winning debaters. UCA Debate and Forensics also competes in tournaments that offer individual events sanctioned by the American Forensics Association.

Scholarships are available to incoming first-year students, transfer students, and current UCA undergraduates. To be eligible for a scholarship, a student must:

- Have demonstrated excellence in debate, forensics, or competitive speech (this may include debate, oratory, interpretive events, congressional debate, mock trial, or similar events);
- Upon enrolling at UCA, declare a major or minor in communication or public relations;
- Plan to compete as a member of UCA Debate and Forensics; and
- Carry at least a 3.00 cumulative GPA in high school coursework (for current high school students or UCA transfers with less than 24 hours) or at least a 2.75 cumulative GPA in college coursework (for current University students and transfers with 24 or more hours).

To maintain eligibility for the scholarship, students must:

- Be an active member of UCA Debate and Forensics. Active membership includes regular attendance
 at practices and competing in at least three tournaments per semester (with mandatory attendance
 at tournaments hosted at UCA, regional and national championships, and other tournaments to be
 determined by the Director of Forensics);
- Show progress toward a major or minor in communication or public relations by enrolling in at least one course contributing to that minor or major each semester; and
- Maintain at least a 2.75 cumulative GPA.
