- Select a country outside the United States or outside your native country that has very different views on international trade and/or immigration. (5 points)
- Provide a history of its trade and/or immigration policies. Compare these policies to the policies in your native country. (20 points)
- Summarize your selected country's culture, government, economy, education level, and demographics, including its values, traditions, and belief systems. How do those characteristics differ in your native country? (20 points)
- Read and cite literature on the link between trade or immigration policies and government, culture, and demographics. (15 points)
- Given the cultural, demographic, economical, governmental, educational, and historical differences of your selected country and your native country, answer the following two questions:
 - How did the differences in trade policies or immigration views come about between the country you selected and your native country? (25 points)
 - Do cultural and/or demographic differences help explain the differences in trade policies/ immigration views between your selected country and your native country? How? (15 points)

A clear, persuasive argument with supportive evidence (see rubric for help) will receive 100% if you follow five simple rules:

1. **All late papers get a score of zero percent.**
2. **Use 12 point font, double space, and type 5-6 pages of text.** 10 points will be taken off for each point font size you use that is bigger than 12. So if you use 14 point font, I will deduct 20 points. Don't use unusual margins either. Cover pages, references, graphs, tables, long quotations, and pictures do not count towards your page count. I will deduct 20 points for each page you are lacking. So if you only write 3 pages, I will take off 40 points.
3. **At least 8 good references (Wikipedia, Yahoo Answers, or similar sites are not "good" references. Use them to find references, but don't use them as a reference).** If you use fewer than 8 references, 5 points will be taken off for the amount of references that you are lacking. So, if you use 6 references, I will take off 10 points. To find good articles, I would recommend using Google Scholar. If you are not sure if your reference is good, then ask me.
4. **Cite your references using APA style.** 10 points will be taken off if you do not use that style.
5. **You are allowed 4 minor spelling/grammar mistakes.** For every mistake after that, I will take 2 points off.
