• Dr. Mauldin reported that on April 17th the Department of Chemistry met to discuss undergraduate students' applications for available research positions in the labs. A total of 29 students applied and 23 were accepted. O the 6 students who were not accepted, 3 students did not want to complete the entire application and 3 students completed the application yet were not able to be placed at this time.

Math:

- Dr. Garimella reported that after 29 years of excellent service to UCA, Dr. Steve Butcher is retiring at the end of this spring semester.
- Dr. Pat Carmack received an extension of his NIH Grant through March 2015 to continue his work on *Integrating Multimodal Brain Imaging Data to Assess Subtle Cognitive Impairment.* The amount of the funding is \$54,461. It is a joint project with University of Texas at Dallas.
- Dr. Matt Thomas has resigned his tenure-tract position.
- On April 26th, approximately three hundred students from across the state will come to UCA to compete in the ACTM State Math Contest.
