## Kien Yow graduated from the UCA CSPA program in 2007 after coming to UCA from Oklahoma State University for his undergraduate

education. For the last year Kien has served as the Institutional Relations Manager at DiKa College in Malaysia where the focus in his new position is to work with local and international recruiting agents and collaborate with business

and education partners. He is also tasked with setting up the International Office to recruit international students to DiKa for the very first time.

Kien says that both being in the CSPA program and working as a Residence Coordinator at the same time really stretched him in many ways, but that it prepared him to be adaptable to work in so many different areas. He credits the real-life experiences shared in classes by Dr. Charlotte Cone, Dr. Ernie Ness, Dr. John Smith, and Dr. Johnny Purvis as really allowing him to "see the big picture of educational institutions " and understand how this is applicable to his positions, including the need to be patient in working the "inevitable bureaucracies." Kien says that the student affairs profession is "still a very alien concept to many institutions in Malaysia, as most education qualifications only revolve around teacher training," but that the CSPA program prepared him to work on both sides of education: academic and administration which allows him to bring greater value to the administrative component and allows him to better meet student needs while sharing the philosophies of the profession with others in Malaysia.



Kien says that every now and then he gets the honor of being invited to speak or host events by non-profit organizations and that some of his most notable events include emceeing the Boys' and Girls' Brigades 6oth Anniversary Celebration, the Stedfast Association's 20<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration, and to speak at First Baptist Church to share his insights on study and career options to the youth.

Kien's words of advice for CSPA grads is to not be afraid "to step out of your comfort zone, to go where the job takes you, and learn!"
