Recognition of and Resources about American Indians

The University of Central Arkansas (UCA) sits near the ancestral, traditional lands of the Quapaw (Downstream People), Osage, and Caddo nations. Other Indigenous Nations such as the Cherokee, Chickasaw, Choctaw, the Muscogee (Creek), and Shawnee also have historic connections to Central Arkansas. While Indigenous individuals and communities currently reside in Central Arkansas, there are no tribal headquarters here. The closest American Indian headquarters is located in Oklahoma.
