


14 FACTORS WERE EVALUATED

Below is a list of select action items based on feedback shared in this year's Campus Climate Survey. Your responses matter and continue to improve our campus. Thank you, UCA Bears!



Physical Plant has budgeted \$100,000 to improve/replace campus sidewalks. \$65,000 went to the sidewalk in front of McAlister Hall.



Physical Plant hosts Campus Safe Walks with UCA Administration and SGA to identify priority areas for outdoor lighting.



Physical Plant has been working to identify areas on campus that are prone to flooding during rain. A contractor was hired to fix the flooding around Harrin Hall.



The Safe@UCA app has a Mobile BlueLight function to alert UCA Police to your device's location as well as call UCA Police Dispatch.



The Safe@UCA app has a Friend Walk feature that allows you to send your location in real-time to a friend so they can watch you as you walk to your destination. There is also a feature to start an emergency call, if needed.



Multiple training sessions are offered through Employee Engagement and Enrichment on difficult conversations, including using models created by Braver Angels.



Diversity, Belonging, Inclusion & Equity Week was created in 2022 to address some campus climate survey concerns. DBIE Week was held October 2-6, 2023.
