Continue the research symposiums; funded through STEMulate and ORSP

Expected Results: Increased collaboration among faculty on peer-reviewed research and mentoring activities.

Actual Results: Mrs. Styles-Foster collaborated with Dr. Dailey and Dr. Trumble in a research project focused on GPA and admission into the MAT program. This research is ongoing and was well received at both Association of Teacher Educators conference in Chicago, as well as the Mid-South Education Research Association in New Orleans. Dr. Whittingham collaborated with Dr. Amy Thompson, Dr. Kevin Powell, and Dr. Erin Shaw on two research projects related to the attitudes of teachers and school librarians toward reading and the attitudes of middle-grade students toward graphic novels. The graphic novel research is ongoing and received a research grant for funding. The attitudes toward reading research were well received at the National Council of Teachers of English conference and the American Association of School Librarians conference.

Dr. Whittingham and Mrs.Styles-Foster completed research on the use of authentic online field experiences and have submitted an article for review.

Dr. Cotabish led a monthly research symposium for COE featuring high-quality researchers.

Dr. Cotabish supported Dr. Price in submitting an article to a gifted journal.

Dr. Herring-Watson completed her dissertation and presented 4 papers at AERA.

The Department of Teaching and Learning made 74 presentations at local, state, regional, national, and international conferences and organizational meetings (as

reported in Digital Measures).

Department faculty directed 16 student learning activities (Dissertation Committee Member, Honors Thesis Advisor, Honors Thesis Committee Member).

Department faculty had 27 peer-reviewed publications (as reported in Digital Measures).

One grant proposal was submitted and funded in conjunction with the Department of Languages, Linguistics, Literatures, and Culture (Debbie Dailey Co-PI on ESOL Grant \$696,760.00). Groves-Scott and Mills received funding for \$100,000 from ForwARd Arkansas and have submitted another proposal for \$1,000,000. Three groups received URC grants (Herring-Watson & Trumble; Wake & Colleagues, Whittingham & Colleagues). Two other grant proposals are under review. 4 programs received graduate recruitment grants. 4 faculty received travel grants from CETAL or other organizations.

Dr. Jackson. Ms. Catherine Miller, and the UCA Educators Rising Collegiate chapter planned educational activities for Conway's Ecofest and volunteered at the event. Whittingham directed program recruitment efforts for COE graduate programs. Individual advising appointments for all students are tailored to monitoring academic progress and providing support as needed (academic, personal).

Graduate programs received recruitment grants from the graduate schools and used social media and conference booths to advertise our programs and specifically target the recruitment of students of color.

Dr. Benson participated in the multistate standard-setting study for the Praxis Early Childhood Assessment.

Faculty utilized digital engagement applications in courses, including Nearpod, Pear Deck, and Padlet. These applications enhanced virtual delivery in COE courses, and faculty modeled the appropriate use of these applications for candidates.

MSIT 3320 students practiced virtual teaching through peer Zoom mini-teach lessons (utilizing Zoom, Nearpod, Pear Deck, Jamboard, Padlet, and other digital tools).

EDUC 4210 students complete modules in which they create their own learning modules in Google Classroom and create digital content for K-12 learners aligned to UDL principles.

ASTL field consists of annotated videos. In the Models of Teaching course, students teach a lesson using one of the course models, annotate and share with classmates. The classmates make feedback annotations followed by instructor feedback. In the Teacher Leadership course, the same model is filled with a school improvement plan. Finally, the

capstone for the ASTL program includes a video of the student teaching a lesson and annotating connections to the seven Teacher Leader Standards.

5. Challenges

External challenges facing our department include losing 3 faculty members and only replacing one in a visiting position. Due to increased scrutiny on SSCH and budget concerns, our class sizes have increased and faculty are required to increase the number of interns to 5 from 4.

6. Opportunities

At our annual retreat, we are going to brainstorm competencies that our students need to be day 1 ready for a classroom. We will compare the competencies with what is taught in our MAT courses and look for gaps in our program. We will be replacing Research Methods with a more practicioner-based course and this brainstorming practice will help guide that work. There is a great demand for residential or apprentice interns who can serve as the teacher of record. We will explore this more with our middle-level program. Also, CSD will now take MAT interns/ applicants which is a great opportunity for our students.

7. Summary

This past year was a very busy and productive year for the Teaching and Learning Department. Our faculty have been stellar in teaching, research, and service and have been committed to innovative teaching and field-based pedagogy that incorporates service learning and culturally responsive practices. The MAT program has continued to have steady enrollment and the Middle-level program has seen a small increase. The GATE program transitioned to a summer-only program and received great reviews and increased enrollment. We are looking forward to continually improving and growing our programs to meet the increasing demand for teachers in the state.
