#### **Mission Statement**

The College of Education prepares educators, leaders, and other professionals to impact Arkansas and beyond by centering equity.

We are proud to be Arkansas's premier educator preparation college. Dedicated to providing exemplary programs for the preparation of professionals, including teacher preparation for elementary, middle level, and secondary education; educational leadership; school counseling; library media; instructional technologies; higher education student personnel administration; and community leadership, the College thrives on innovation and engagement. With an emphasis on teaching, research, and service, the members of the College of Education, along with their counterparts in supporting programs across campus, demonstrate a commitment to the improvement of programs and services by collaboratively working with organizations that have teaching and human development as their mission.

Goal 1: The College will continuously engage partners to maximize program quality and opportunity for all.

#### **Completed Activities**

Dean's Office:

- The MOUs were coordinated with local partners see link here.
- The 2022 Partnership Cafe was held on May 10th at UCA Downtown. Representatives from partner institutions as well as the COE advisory board met to review COE field data and discuss impending changes to the field placement structure and specific strategies for meeting student and teacher candidate needs.
- The programs continued to host Advisory Board meetings to connect with stakeholders. Additionally, the college has an Executive Advisory Board. All program and college advisory boards maintain minutes/agenda and post these online - <u>https://uca.edu/education/advisory-boards/</u>.
- The partnership with Arch Ford continued to evolve. The Assessment Director met with the staff from Arch Ford and discussed collaboration on new teacher mentoring and data sharing. The Director sits on Arch Ford's advisory board. Arch Ford faculty sit on our Executive Advisory Board.

- Faculty in the COE served key roles within professional organization boards in the state and at the national level (e.g., ACTELA, AGATE, ArAACTE, PLSB, ArCEC, ArATE, ALA, MSERA, CEC-TAG, ).
- COE hosted four ad hoc working groups involving K-12 partners in revising course curriculum and key assessments. These groups focused on: revising internship requirements to adjust for new course load requirements, revisions to the unit plan to pull in more language centering equity, revisions to impact on student learning to break project into 2 pieces, creation of new equity rubric to support TESS observations
- The COE continued involvement in the ADE Educators Rising program to network with local schools, teachers, and students studying education as a profession.
- Continued conversations as the state rules change removing CAEP as an accreditation requirement and moving to a state-review process.
- Submission of the CAEP annual report recognized as an exemplar for data staging and transparency.
- Continued involvement of COE faculty on CAEP standards teams and being involved by CAEP on panel presentations for best-practices and for guidance on accreditation publications.
- COE faculty recognized for UCA roles. Candice Maxwell (Recipient: Diversity); Alicia Cotabish (Finalist: Research); Donna Wake (Recipient: Teaching).
- The COE hosted the Educators Rising State Conference on Tues., April 5. There were 324 rising educators from 25 high schools in attendance and 42 Educators Rising collegiate chapter members (who also served as pailests). <u>https://educatorsrisingarkansasconference.my.canva.site/</u>
- The COE continued the concurrent enrollment/Educators Rising partnerships (since 2020) with Conway, Fayetteville, and Conway Christian.
- Due to COVID restrictions, we hosted the concurrent enrollment/Educators Rising partnerships virtually through one-on-on Zooms in the Fall of 2021 in addition to them attending the Region 2 Educators Rising virtual conference that we hosted. In Spring 2022 we hosted the state Educators Rising conference in which our partners attended. There were other follow-up one-on-one Zoom meetings with partners in Spring 2022.
- Dean Groves-Scott was re-elected to chair the Arkansas Education Deans Council.
- The COE revised the mission statement to focus more specifically on diversity, belonging, inclusion and equity.

Technology Learning Center

- Worked closely with Department Chairs from Teaching & Learning, Leadership Studies, and Elementary, Literacy, and Special Education to update department websites and add more user friendly graphics and links.
- Collaborated with Program Coordinators from LIBM, Ph.D., and Reading to update program websites to make it easier for current and future students to locate information.
- Have increased usage of social media (Facebook, Instagram, and Twitter) for the COE, including advertising for UCA Day of Giving, which increased our donations.
- Continue to Collaborate with the directors of the Mashburn Center to produce their newsletter.
- As part of the COE Tech Committee, organized and facilitated professional development in March and April 2022 for COE faculty and staff. This included various session topics based on feedback from survey.
- Organized Summer 2022 professional development. This will include over 18 presentations. Worked with Dr. Michael Mills to secure Arkansas Professional Development codes.
- Provide MacBooks for checkout to COE faculty/students in need.
- Planned and prepared Grab and Go maker packs for K-6 students in lieu of in person summer camps. Packs included an activity, literacy aspect, and UCA swag. Collaborated with T&L, Leadership Studies, and ELSE to assemble kits.

Elementary, Literacy, and Special Education:

- The UCA Mashburn Center for Learning provided professional development to the following:
  - \$125,000 from Great Rivers Coop for Learning Strategies
  - \$76,000 from SWHS
  - \$15,200 from Mabelvale Middle
  - \$15,000 from RoseBud SD
  - Partnered with DESE in Inclusive Practices
- The UCA Mashburn Center for Learning collaborated with the University of Kansas on badging and micro-credentialing.
- The ELSE department continued their partnerships with Bigelow, Boys and Girls Club, Child Study Center, NLRSD.
- ELSE department has partnered with Pediatrics Plus for service learning surrounding literacy and social/emotional learning.

- ELSE's M.S.E. in Literacy with Dyslexia Endorsement increased their reach and currently has students in 30 states and 3 countries besides the United States (Philippines, S. Korea, Belize).
- Several ELSE faculty members served as EPP Representatives to ADE to work on:
  - Reading and Dyslexia Arkansas
    - Selecting the New K-6 and K-12 SPED Reading Exam
  - Several faculty are involved in Educators Rising, CEC/ARCEC/SCEC holding board positions in ARCEC
  - All ELSE programs (undergraduate special education, undergrads competencies
  - EPP R.I.S.E. Initiativeduate K-6, MSE/MAT/ GC special education, MSE Literacy and Dyslexia GC) met and shared data with community partners and requested feedback on programmatic issues.
- \$250 service learning grant for ELSE 4325 Intern I students to hold a prom for Compass Academy a private, non-profit school developed for children with developmental disabilities or difficulty adjusting to the public school setting. The prom was held on the UCA Campus in the Mirror Room April 23rd.
- ELSE 4306 partnered with Milestones, Inc., a partner agency of United Way of Central Arkansas that provides early intervention for children birth to 5 years who are delayed or at risk of developmental delays to medical conditions. The students made decorations for their annual fundraiser Omelets with the Toadmaster.
- Our Special Education faculty have engaged with ADE to provide a "Special Education Resource Academy." This grant (@ \$260,000), provided funding for about 40 graduate students to complete our Special Education Resource license program.

Leadership Studies:

- The School Counseling program collaborated with school counselors across Arkansas in three grade levels (elementary, middle, and high school) to strategically improve the program key assessment which focuses on counselors-in-training (CIT) abilities to manage a school counseling program while being accountable for student success. The data from this key assessment measure CITs' abilities to understand data-driven decision making, demonstrate leadership and advocacy, use current technologies, and use collaboration to promote student learning and achievement.
- CSPA program partnered with two offices at UCA (Office of Student Success and Online, Transfer, & Returning Student Services) and the Center for Social Innovation at Oklahoma State University- Oklahoma City within the Assessment in Higher Education course for fall 2021. Students in

the course worked directly with the partners to perform a full assessment project evaluating current practices and identify recommendations for continual improvement.

- CSPA program hosted a Practicum Fair to support successful placement of 10 students with field experience sites with various functional areas across UCA's campus.
- LIBM program coordinated with the TLC to facilitate a digital playground during AlIA's spring conference (February 2022).

Teaching and Learning:

- Individual programs met with their corresponding advisory boards which are inclusive of school personnel to gather feedback about current post-Pandemic needs in the school to offer assistance by our programs.
- MSIT 4325 continued to work with students virtually for the early field over the course of six weeks. Candidates were matched with 7th grade students and worked on embedding literacy within their own content areas by creating lessons that were taught in real-time via Zoom.
- Dr. Whittingham presented quarterly booktalks at Greenbrier High School.
- EDUC 1300 students conducted teacher interviews and attended livestreamed school board meetings to gain early field experiences.

Goal 2: The College will develop, implement, and review a Strategic Equity Plan that includes processes, practices, and polices that anchor equity.

#### **Completed Activities**

Dean's Office:

- The Dean's Office continues to work with the Disruptive Educational Equity Project (DEEP/ DBIE) to offer intensive professional development related to race, religion, sexual orientation, inclusion, and equity.
- The Dean, Associate Dean, and COE Distinguished Equity Fellow have developed and delivered a series of workshops for all undergraduate teacher education candidates. The workshops are based on the DEEP training. The workshops span the beginning of their programs through Internship II.
- Dean's office supported programs to write recruitment and retention goals based on baseline data for underrepresented candidate populations and for identified critical shortage areas.
- The EPP establishes and maintains a system that monitors candidate attributes and dispositions beyond academic ability that candidates must demonstrate at admissions and during the program. Throughout the teacher education program, candidates are periodically reviewed for dispositional and academic readiness to advance through the program. At each of these reviews (or "gates"), candidates may be approved to continue, may be subject to remedial steps before continuing, or may be dismissed from the program. Remediation may include: (1) repeating course(s) where performance did not meet expectations; (2) following professional growth plans for identified areas of improvement; and/or (3) additional work or activities to gain the sufficient experiences to continue.
- The Dean's Office works closely with the Distinguished Equity Fellow, Dr. Candice Maxwell, to plan and implement the following activities:
  - Conducting and developing research on educational equity issues with a research group.
  - Re-launched the Equity Clearinghouse. This includes the updated EdEquity libguide.
  - The Dean's Office and Distinguished Equity Fellow, Dr. Candice Maxwell, offered these professional learning opportunities
  - "Understanding the Importance of Racial Equity in Education"

- "The Psychology of Oppression"
- "Diagnosing Issues of Equity"
- The COE hosted the 2nd Annual Centering Equity Conference on May 11-12, 2022. The Keynote speaker was Mr. Jarrod Benjamin, CEO and Founder of The Lead Firm.
- The COE launched the Centering Equity Learning Series in the Fall of 2021. This was the pilot year. There were 23 participants.
- The COE Diversity Committee was restructured and renamed to more closely align with DBIE. It is now the Equity Committee.
- The Equity Committee produced a report, *Considerations for the College* of Education's Equity and Inclusion Statement and Future Equity Efforts which outlines strategic actions the COE should consider to move along the DBIE continuum and develop an actionable statement that aligns with the mission and vision of the college.

Technology Learning Center (TLC):

- The TLC provided tech support for Admitted Students Days in which high school seniors visit the campus and tour their program of choice.
- TLC staff attended COE Diversity, Belonging, Inclusion, and Equity (DBIE) training.
- TLC Director attended/presented at the ISTE virtual conference and AASL national conference..
- TLC staff collaborated with the Distinguished Equity Fellow to create/update the Education Equity webpage.
- TLC provided tech support and advertising for the Centering Equity conference and its speakers.
- TLC staff provided tech support for the Educators Rising conference.

Elementary Literacy and Special Education:

- Revised the MSE in Literacy Diversity course and key assessment
- ELSE 4325 Intern I students attend DBIE 2 hour training provided by Dr. Groves-Scott and Dr. Mills before going into their field placement.
- An ELSE faculty member is serving as the COE Equity fellow.
- Faculty continue to participate in DEEP/DBIE training.
- Several faculty have embedded information pertaining to diversity and equity into their conversations with students in their classes.

Leadership Studies:

- CSPA program supported successful completion of the program for 15 students from diverse backgrounds
  - 8 Black or African American, 3 Hispanic/Latinx (including 1 international student from Mexico), 3 White, 1 Two or more races
- Research studies on equity CSPA theses on equity:
  - Smith-Todd, A. (2022). *Holistic Student-Athlete Support: A Comparative Case Study Approach.*
  - Erickson, K. (2022). Out of the Shadows: The Lived Experience of Active-duty Military Undergraduates.
- ITEC graduated its first cohort of the Online Teacher Academy with all but one student passing the state Online Teaching exam. That is a 97% pass rate.

Teaching and Learning:

- New faculty participated in the DEEP/DBIE professional development
- All faculty participated in at least 3 hours of professional development on DBIE
- Continued revision of EDUC 3322 to focus on diversity, inclusion, and equity
- Creation of Educators Rising Collegiate chapter organization that discusses and focuses on conversations about diversity, belonging, inclusion, and equity
- MAT will hold an end of the year meeting to discuss ways to broaden the ability for all candidates to have more options available to them for their internship semester. This will likely benefit those who may be in locations across the state that often lack opportunities or support that are needed for novice teachers.
- Gorski and Pothini's case studies on diversity and social justice are used as a teaching tool in MAT 5320-Classroom Management.

Goal 3: All College programs will sustain a data-driven quality assurance process for continuous program improvement.

Completed Activities:

Dean's Office:

- The dean's office continued to support the work of accreditation and quality assurance through multiple CAEP-based initiatives (e.g., advanced program assessment reviews, program annual reports). The EPP successfully passed CAEP review in AY 2020-2021 with no Areas for Improvement or Stipulations.
- CAEP Committees worked to evaluate existing key assessments against CAEP revised expectations (initial programs, advanced programs)
- COE hosted the CAEP site visit in fall of 2021. The visit and subsequent report noted no weakness or stipulations.
- The COE worked with departments to establish dispositions tracking data collection forms (Airtable) and protocols. Additionally, undergraduate program coordinators formally approved a new dispositions rubric designed to be used across initial licensure programs as part of the new admission and retention "gates" system.
- The field coordinators worked with the Dean's office and the TLC to build systems to better track candidates' field experiences in order to provide candidates more breadth and depth in their experiences. Field coordinators also worked with Dean's office on following initiatives:
- The implementation of a new online system for candidates to apply for Internship online was introduced.
- Mentor surveys were consolidated to collect data from school-based partners in the field. There were 12-14 different surveys employed by various programs to collect data from the school-based mentors across programs and at various points in the candidate's progression.
- Recommendations were made pertaining to online coaching modules for mentors. There were recommendations to create online screencasts on the field website(s). Sidenote: The Dean's Office recommended consolidating field websites into one website/space.
- Data were collected for identified key assessments in COE across all initial licensure programs. Rubric key assessments included Unit Plan, Impact Project, and TESS. Survey key assessments included End-of-Program, Technology, Field, and Multicultural Efficacy.

Technology Learning Center

• The TLC assisted the COE Director of Assessment and Accreditation with the data collection & analysis for annual program reporting for all COE initial licensure programs and field placements.

Candidate Services:

- OCS provides updated Airtable "views" that provide program coordinators with real-time data on candidates in their program. Through these views, program coordinators can track program applicants, admitted students, licensure exams completion in internship, and students who have graduated but are not licensed.
- The accreditation process was supported via data collection systems and data reporting.
- OCS implemented the Stacker platform for undergraduate candidates to view individual admission and licensure records. Candidates can access their record at any time. Data is updated in real-time as it is entered into Airtable.

Elementary Literacy and Special Education:

- Realigned K-6 program with CAEP and ADE standards
- Created two new model assessments within the K-6 program
- Piloted two model assessments in K-6 program
- Realigned MSE in Literacy with CAEP, ADE, IDA, and ILA standards
- Created 2 new model assessments within the MSE in Literacy program
- Meetings with graduate literacy faculty to analyze/discuss/make changes as a result from the yearly program report
- Realigned/created two Model Assessments for the graduate special education program
- All programs (UG K-6; UG SPED K-12; MSE Reading Dyslexia Endorsement; Graduate Special Education/MSE/GC) within the ELSE department successfully submitted annual SPA reports in October.
- All annual reports were shared with their respective Advisory Boards as well as with the ELSE faculty. Through this process constituents' feedback on ways to enhance respective programs were shared.
- The MSE in Literacy with Dyslexia Endorsement was accredited by the International Dyslexia Association (IDA).
- The undergraduate and graduate programs continue the work of aligning these programs with the CEEDAR Center's High Leverage Practices (HLPs) standards supported by CEC. This will be ongoing into 2021-2022.
- Faculty members provided/offered study sessions for various Praxis assessments.

Leadership Studies:

- In the School Counseling program faculty have created innovative learning experiences for their CITs to complete. One example is the creation of a Community Consultation Resources Electronic Brochure through researching the private and community resources in their local and statewide communities. This assignment helps these future school counselors to provide more extensive services to students and families than they would otherwise be able to provide. Another learning experience is preparation of a professional presentation for the National Career Development Conference (NCDA) Global Conference. Each student prepares a topic related to career development and/or career counseling in K-12 school settings. Students use peer-reviewed research to create the presentations and can submit these proposals for acceptance to this highly competitive and well-known professional conference. A third transformational learning experience in the School Counseling program is the Assessment Instrument Review Presentation in which the future school counselor completes an in-depth review of one instrument used for assessment by counselors. The student must provide; an overview of the development of the instrument, empirical support of the reliability and validity for the instrument, the administration and interpretation policies, applicability/implications for counseling interventions, and references. Through having an in-depth understanding on one instrument, students have an increased ability to see the benefits and drawbacks of using a variety of instruments to assess a diverse K-12 student population.
- In partnership with assistantship sites, CSPA program continued to recruit a diverse incoming cohort.
  - CSPA welcomed 13 new students across 2021-2022.
    - 10 Full-time, 3 part-ime
    - 6 White, 4 Black or African American, 2 Hispanic/Latinx, 1 International Student (Thailand)
    - Undergraduate institutions represented 7 states from Oregon to North Carolina
- CSPA program hosted first annual in-person CSPA Day. This recruitment event brought prospective students to campus to engage with current students, complete program interview, and interview with multiple graduate assistantship sites

Teaching and Learning:

- Program coordinators review data annually,file annual reports analyzing their data and tracking use of data to make curriculum and program changes. This process involves collaborating with advisory groups to interpret data. They submit a formal report to the dean's office for review by the assessment and accreditation coordinator (due Oct 15; returned Jan 15). Data includes key assessment and survey feedback.
- Program coordinators give reports and updates at regular faculty meetings.
- Data calibration sessions for all supervisors held in fall 2021 and spring 2022
- Program coordinators at the initial level work on committees to analyze data in order to make recommendations to the college as well as revise and update key assessments
- Program coordinators at the advanced level work with the director of assessment to revise key assessments for quality assurance using a protocol adopted by the COE in AY 2020-2021
- EDUC 1300 working group meets regularly to review course survey data and make adjustments designed to support recruitment and retainment efforts.

Goal 4: The College will incorporate transformational and innovative learning experiences that are grounded in evidence-based practices.

Completed Activities:

Dean's Office:

- The COE Diversity Committee members participated in the UCA Institutional Diversity Committee and activities.
- The COE continued to support a wide range of recruitment and retention events which established a presence at various recruiting events: (Advanced, Initial).
- The COE hosted the "Educators Rising" regional and state conferences to support high school students interested in pursuing a degree in education. High school students who attended are interested in pursuing a career in education and involved in various education initiatives (e.g., Educators Rising, etc.).
- The COE continued to be involved in the ADE Educators Rising program to network with local schools, teachers, and students, which aided students in their studies of education as a profession.
- The Office supported the in-house development of an online Ethics Training Program to meet the state requirement for MAT students to be trained in the standards for ethical behavior prior to gaining provisional certification.

Technology Learning Center

- Organized Summer 2022 professional development. This will include over 18 presentations. Worked with Dr. Michael Mills to secure Arkansas Professional Development authorization.
- As part of the COE Tech Committee, organized and facilitated professional development in March and April 2022 for COE faculty and staff. This included various session topics based on feedback from the survey.
- Planned and prepared Grab and Go maker packs for K-6 students in lieu of in person summer camps. Packs included an activity, literacy aspect, and UCA swag. Collaborated with T&L, Leadership Studies, and ELSE to assemble kits.
- Collaborated with Dr. Nykela Jackson (T&L) to lead educational stations for the Educators Rising programs.

Candidate Services:

- OCS continued to use the new EDUC 1300 survey to directly ask EDUC 1300 students about their plans to enter the education field (or not).
- OCS coordinated virtual recruiting events with the UCA Office of Admissions and COE leadership.

Elementary Literacy and Special Education:

- Bears Read Students in ELSE 3305 and ELSE 4319 provided online literacy reading and activities to K-6 students;
- Bears Read Students in ELSE 3305 and ELSE 4319 provided online literacy story time and activities to preschoolers with disabilities through Pediatrics Plus;
- Students in ELSE 4305 participated in field training in administering assessments, planning and executing explicit, systematic lessons, delivery of structured literacy lessons incorporating multisensory learning to K-6 students in Bigelow.
- Worked with Program Coordinator to align Jr. Block Practicum with Internship I (teaching morning meeting lesson, social studies lesson, and a writing lesson -TESS format). Supervisors observe and provide feedback to help scaffold students and better prepare them for Internship I.
- Bears Read Students in ELSE 3305 and ELSE 4319 provided online literacy and social/emotional learning activities for Pre-K students with and without disabilities at Pediatrics Plus.
- MSE in Literacy Practicum using both Video Ant and BIE.
- MSE in Literacy designed a Practicum II which will also use both Video Ant and BIE.

Leadership Studies:

- The School Counseling program retained and recruited more faculty members who come from diverse racial, ethnic, age, national origin, geographic, and gender backgrounds. Through this recruitment and retention of diverse faculty, the School Counseling students are provided with enhanced multicultural learning opportunities which will more effectively prepare them to work with the increasingly diverse K-12 student population.
- ITEC involved recent alumni to participate in a panel discussion with current students to discuss career options after graduation.

- Ongoing collaborations among faculty members in multi-disciplinary research and publishing.
- The LIBM program coordinated with the TLC and Dr. Nykela Jackson (T&L) to lead educational stations for the Educators Rising programs.

Teaching and Learning:

- Middle-level and MAT programs have transitioned to teaching the science of reading using evidence-based practices.
- Dr. Benson participated in the multistate standard-setting study for the Praxis Early Childhood Assessment.
- Faculty utilized digital engagement applications in courses, including Nearpod, Pear Deck, and Padlet. These applications enhanced virtual delivery in COE courses, and faculty modeled the appropriate use of these applications for candidates.
- MSIT 3320 students practiced virtual teaching through peer Zoom miniteach lessons (utilizing Zoom, Nearpod, Pear Deck, Jamboard, Padlet, and other digital tools).
- EDUC 4210 students complete modules in which they create their own learning modules in Google Classroom and create digital content for K-12 learners aligned to UDL principles.
- ASTL field consists of annotated videos. In the Models of Teaching course, students teach a lesson using one of the course models, annotate and share with classmates. The classmates make feedback annotations followed by instructor feedback. In the Teacher Leadership course, the same model is filled with a school improvement plan. Finally, the capstone for the ASTL program includes a video of the student teaching a lesson and annotating connections to the seven Teacher Leader Standards.

Goal 5: The College will recruit, retain, and support a diversity of students, faculty, and staff.

**Completed Activities:** 

Dean's Office:

- The COE maintained data collection across key assessments (rubrics and surveys) for both initial and advanced programs.
- The COE had an annual reporting system for all EPP programs. SPA and/or annual reports are due each fall and were submitted for peer review and feedback. Data was shared to program faculty and program advisory boards which included external, school-based partners. Agendas and minutes from these meetings were maintained by program coordinators and made available by request when necessary. This practice was expanded in the 2017-2018 school year in charging appropriate COE committees to form advisory groups or hold focus group events where data was shared and feedback was requested.
- The COE planned several faculty PD events that included analysis of data with faculty. Data was shared in August at the opening workshop, in October at the EPP Data Day event, in January at the winter faculty PD, and in all program coordinator meetings as appropriate. Additionally, data was shared with the program coordinators and department chairs at the close of each semester on key assessment data.
- The COE continued to work on reliability around key assessments. Studies that used Fleiss Kappa statistics indicated that the COE continued successful work to establish reliability on key assessments.
- The EPP has embedded diversity as an assessed criterion in multiple key assessments, including: Disposition, Unit Plan, Impact on Student Learning, and TESS (Danielson Framework for Teaching). Candidate ability to support diverse learners is specifically addressed in the analysis documents in the evidence room (i.e., InTASC Analysis, Research Component, CCR Analysis). Additionally, ability to support diverse stakeholders is an item in multiple surveys used by the EPP, including: internship survey suite (diversity panel presentation), candidate feedback on clinical experiences, candidate end-of-program, employer satisfaction, graduate satisfaction.
- The EPP has revised its system for tracking clinical experiences to ensure candidates have sufficient depth, breadth, diversity, coherence, and duration and to ensure that candidates demonstrate their developing effectiveness and positive impact on all students' learning and development. Data had been tracked in Google Forms and Chalk and Wire. Now all data is tracked in Airtable. An

example of candidates' clinical experiences audit is provided in the evidence room as well as program level sequence and structure maps.

• The EPP has recruitment and retention plans in place with articulated goals to recruit and support completion of high-quality candidates from a broad range of backgrounds and diverse populations. Goals include an admitted pool of candidates who reflect the diversity of America's P-12 students. Additionally, the EPP involvement in the Educators Rising initiative, the revision of the EPP Introduction to Education courses, and the addition of an Introduction class survey speak to the EPP commitment to diverse candidate recruitment. The EPP tracks candidate admission and enrollment with disaggregated data to highlight the inclusion of diverse candidates.

#### Candidate Services:

- Candidate Services revised internal systems (such as program applications) to better track student progress.
- Candidate Services continued to monitor retention efforts for candidates from admission through program completion.

#### ELSE:

- ELSE Graduate Program coordinators received \$4000.00 for recruitment activities to recruit high quality students.
- Programs shared annual reports with faculty and community partners who reviewed data including all model assessment data making recommendations to overall success of our programs.
- Dispositions tracking discussions continued this year to make sure it is a seamless system with the goal of supporting struggling students.
- Recruited diverse faculty and offered math and science position
- Continues to provide a Clothes Closet for professional dress and a Food Pantry
- Provided self-care activities with the COE for its students.

#### Leadership Studies:

- The School Counseling program retained and recruited more faculty members who come from diverse racial, ethnic, age, national origin, geographic, and gender backgrounds. Through this recruitment and retention of diverse faculty, the School Counseling students are provided with enhanced multicultural learning opportunities which will more effectively prepare them to work with the increasingly diverse K-12 student population.
- ITEC involved recent alumni to participate in a panel discussion with current students to discuss career options after graduation.
- LIBM Graduate Program coordinator received \$2500 for recruitment activities to recruit high quality students through attendance of the Arkansas Association of

Instructional Media conference and summer professional development sessions for K-12 educators.

Teaching and Learning:

- All programs track dispositions and program completers complete surveys on program effectiveness and areas of needed growth.
- MAT and middle level program faculty meet to analyze data and make recommendations relevant to the overall program, individual programs, and candidates with and without provisional licenses.
- The COE, specifically the MAT program, continues to support the in-house development of an online Ethics Training Program to meet the state requirement for MAT students to be trained in the standards for ethical behavior prior to gaining provisional certification.
- Dr. Benson attended the Inclusive Hiring Practices workshop.
- Dr. Jackson hosted Educators Rising students from Quitman, Conway, Conway Christian, and Greenbrier High School on campus to participate in educational activities.
- Dr. Jackson served as a guest speaker for Quitman, Fayetteville, Conway, and Greenbrier High School to discuss college expectations and best practices to be successful.
- Dr. Jackson. Ms. Catherine Miller, and the UCA Educators Rising Collegiate chapter planned educational activities for Conway's Ecofest and volunteered at the event.
- Dr. Whittingham directed program recruitment efforts for COE graduate programs.
- Individual advising appointments for all students are tailored to monitoring academic progress and providing support as needed (academic, personal).
- Graduate programs received recruitment grants from the graduate schools and used social media and conference booths to advertise our programs and specifically target the recruitment of students of color.
