- VIII. Ms. Carrie Farris asked about how EdS students would benefit from participation in the PhD program. It was explained by Dr. White and Dr. Loyless that students with an EdS can transfer credit hours from the EdS into the PhD program to meet the K-12 Concentration requirements. Ms. Farris stated that advertising the opportunity to transfer credits into the PhD more to EdS students would inspire them to apply to the PhD program.
