#### 5. **Challenges**

External challenges facing our department include losing 1 faculty member in July and replacing her with a visiting position. Noel Geringer was new to higher education and did not have a lot of time to learn. She did a fantastic job and has been hired in a permanent clinical position. In trying to be good university citizens, we have reduced the number of sections in courses resulting in increased class sizes. As we continue to face the enrollment clift, our MAT program is holding steady but we have seen a decline in middle-level enrollment. We anticipate increased enrollment in some classes since the STEMteach program was dissolved.

Another challenge is the limited travel funds. Our faculty are very productive and love to present their work at conferences. Our faculty who do not travel have designated their funds for our tenure track people.

### 6. Opportunities

At our annual retreat, we worked together to brainstorm competencies that our students need to be day 1 ready for a classroom. We examined competencies with what is taught in our MAT courses and looked for gaps in our program. From this analysis, we formed a workgroup and created a new course: Contemporary Practices of Teaching, and submitted the appropriate curriculum paperwork. There is a great demand for residential or apprentice interns who can serve as the teacher of record. We will continue to explore residency/apprentice internships more with our middle-level program and try to determine how we can support our candidates if they take on the role of teacher of record.

### 7. Summary

Faculty have exhibited exceptional dedication and collaboration throughout the year, actively engaging in the enhancement of our programs. They have consistently pursued innovative teaching approaches, ensuring that their students are prepared for their classrooms from day one. The faculty's commitment to student success is evident in their constructive feedback on student work, as well as their mentorship of students during internships.

Moreover, faculty members willingly contributed their expertise, volunteering both when called upon and proactively. They demonstrated their commitment to fostering a supportive environment by mentoring new faculty members within and outside our department. Additionally, their collaborative efforts on research projects exemplify their dedication to advancing knowledge in the field of education, resulting in numerous valuable contributions.

Looking ahead, the department anticipates new challenges with the arrival of three new faculty members and the introduction of new leadership in the MAT and Middle-Level programs. However, based on their track record, we have full confidence that the faculty will confront these challenges head-on and continue to provide meaningful support to their students and to new faculty.

# **Summary Evaluation**

### Challenges

External challenges facing our department include losing 1 faculty member in July and replacing her with a visiting position. Noel Geringer was new to higher education and did not have a lot of time to learn. She did a fantastic job and has been hired in a permanent clinical position. In trying to be good university citizens, we have reduced the number of sections in courses resulting in increased class sizes. As we continue to face the enrollment clift, our MAT program is holding steady but we have seen a decline in middle-level enrollment. We anticipate increased enrollment in some classes since the STEMteach program was dissolved.

Another challenge is the limited travel funds. Our faculty are very productive and love to present their work at conferences. Our faculty who do not travel have designated their funds for our tenure track people.

# **Opportunities**

At our annual retreat, we worked together to brainstorm competencies that our students need to be day 1 ready for a classroom. We examined competencies with what is taught in our MAT courses and looked for gaps in our program. From this analysis, we formed a workgroup and created a new course: Contemporary Practices of Teaching, and submitted the appropriate curriculum paperwork. There is a great demand for residential or apprentice interns who can serve as the teacher of record. We will continue to explore residency/apprentice internships more with our middle-level program and try to determine how we can support our candidates if they take on the role of teacher of record.

# Summary

Faculty have exhibited exceptional dedication and collaboration throughout the year, actively engaging in the enhancement of our programs. They have consistently pursued innovative teaching approaches, ensuring that their students are prepared for their classrooms from day one. The faculty's commitment to student success is evident in their constructive feedback on student work, as well as their mentorship of students during internships.

Moreover, faculty members willingly contributed their expertise, volunteering both when called upon and proactively. They demonstrated their commitment to fostering a supportive environment by mentoring new faculty members within and outside our department. Additionally, their collaborative efforts on research projects exemplify their dedication to advancing knowledge in the field of education, resulting in numerous valuable contributions.

Looking ahead, the department anticipates new challenges with the arrival of three new faculty members and the introduction of new leadership in the MAT and Middle-Level programs. However, based on their track record, we have full confidence that the faculty will confront these challenges head-on and continue to provide meaningful support to their students and to new faculty.
