Note: UCA Core: R designated courses in economics are ECON 3310 Public Finance and ECON 3330 Environmental Economics.

** Upper division foreign language classes may be used depending on the course content. Consult with your advisor about options.

Foreign Language (9 Hours)

Students must complete three hours in a foreign language on the 2000-level or above.

Minor (18 Hours)

Students must choose a minor. 12 hours must be from upper division courses (3000-4000 level).

Electives (to equal 120 hours)

Upper Division UCA Core – Responsible Living

The Responsible Living requirement can be met by choosing a designated course in the Global Electives, Minor or general electives.

SUMMARY OF GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

1. A minimum of 120 hours earned from the following areas
 - ❖ UCA Lower Division Core - 38 hours
 - UCA Lower Division Core requirements can be found at:

 - UCA Lower division core requirements for Critical Inquiry Social Science and either Responsible Living or Diversity in World Cultures will be completed as students complete the Economics Foundation courses
 - Students may complete their UCA Lower Division Core requirements by taking classes either inside or outside of the College of Business
 - ❖ UCA Upper Division Core
 - At least one upper division course in each of the following categories is required: Diversity (D), Effective Communication (C), Responsible Living (R), Critical Inquiry (I), and Capstone Experience (Z)
 - A course may satisfy up to 2 of these requirements
 - Students will meet each of these requirements except for Responsible Living by completing the major required courses. The Responsible Living requirement can be met by choosing a designated course in the Global Electives, Minor or general electives.
 - ❖ Major – 27-39 hours*
 - ❖ Foreign Language – 0-9 hours*
 - ❖ Minor – 18 -24 hours*
 - ❖ Electives to equal 120 hours

A course may not be double counted in the major and in the minor.

A student needs 40 hours of upper division level credit (3000 – 4000 level courses).

* The major will vary from 27-39 hours depending on the overlap between the UCA Lower Division Core courses and major courses.

Foreign language: A student with no previous experience in a foreign language normally will enroll in the 1310 course for the language. Students with prior experience in a language are strongly encouraged to take the departmental placement test before enrolling in their first course.

2. No more than 30 hours may be taken in Business. Business courses are considered to be courses with the following prefixes: ACCT, FINA, INSU, MGMT, MIS, MKTG, QMTH.
3. At least a 2.000 Grade Point Average is required overall, in the major, and in the minor.
