The English major is comprised of a total of 37 upper- and lower-division credit hours, outlined below.

Additionally, all English majors and English Education majors must fulfill the BA Foreign Language Requirement: complete three hours of a 2000-level required third semester class in a foreign language (FREN, SPAN, GERM, CHIN, or JAPN or equivalent). Students must also fulfill the university undergraduate degree requirement: complete 40 hours of upper-division (3000- or 4000-level) coursework.
