A Chronicle Campus-wide site license offers unrestricted access to Chronicle.com on your institution's computer network. Features and benefits of Chronicle Campus-wide include: (1) No need for passwords, logins, or user names. (2)Text from each print issue posted on Mondays without delay or embargo. NY Times Historical Content 1851-2007	We are currently paying a yearly subscription (\$15,000) for this product (basically a lease).
