Women's Giving Circle Established 2014

Vision:

The Women's Giving Circle (WGC) was established to provide and encourage unique learning and leadership development opportunities that will enrich the lives of women and girls.

Mission:

Through the financial support of its members, the WGC strives to make a difference for UCA, its programs, its faculty, staff, students and organizations by providing an innovative source of funding. Objectives:

Create a pool of grant funds from women to women, focusing on projects and programs benefiting women and girls.

Enrich the lives of women and girls.

Allocate funds and award grants based on a majority preference expressed by vote of WGC members.

Bring about change.

Publicly recognize the impact of funded programs and projects.

Encourage women as leaders in philanthropy.

Connect women alumnae and friends of UCA directly with projects and programs of the university.

Grant Priorities

The WGC grants are intended to encourage creative programs that support unique learning and leadership development opportunities that will enrich the lives of women and girls.

Frequently, good ideas require funding not easily available from annual budget sources. The UCA Foundation WGC has allocated funds from individual membership gifts to invest in creative projects that fit within the framework of the strategic goals and mission of the University in meeting educational needs, as well as the mission of the WGC.

- Proposals must be specific to the needs of programs dedicated to women and girls.
- Grants will be funded in amounts ranging from \$500 to \$2,000 and may be partially funded based on committee recommendations.
- Grant funds are distributed in the fall and/or spring.
- Awardees must provide a one page six month progress report on the success of the grant.

Grants Committee

A committee has been formed for the general purpose of reviewing applications for these special grants. The committee, consisting of current paid members of the Women's Giving Circle, will:

- 1. Review requests for proposals;
- 2. Determine whether the program fits the WGC mission and University purposes;
- 3. Consider the program's merits;
- 4. The decision about award(s) will be based upon a majority vote of WGC members.
