The Intensive English Program (IEP) at the University of Central Arkansas strives to enable students to function on a day-to-day basis in an English speaking environment, prepare them to successfully complete academic work in regular university courses, and introduce them to American culture.



The IEP provides instruction to

- International undergraduate or graduate students applying for admission to a US college or university who must first improve their language skills
- International undergraduate or graduate students who have been admitted to UCA but require or desire further language preparation
- International students and community residents who wish to improve their language skills for personal or professional purposes
- International groups that require specialized language and cultural courses and activities

Why the UCA Intensive English Program?

Since 1992, the IEP has been devoted to giving students the best instruction possible with highly trained, dedicated faculty who use the most up-to-date instructional techniques in the field of second language learning. After completing the program, most students begin their academic studies at UCA or other universities and colleges in the United States.

What to expect:

- The IEP has six levels of study from beginner to advanced.
- Fall and spring terms are 8 weeks in length; summer terms are 5 weeks in length.
- Students take an English proficiency test and are placed in the appropriate level during orientation.
- Students study Academic Grammar, Writing, Reading, Listening/Speaking, and Vocabulary.
- No TOEFL score is required to exit the IEP for undergraduate studies.
- All teachers in the IEP have advanced degrees in areas related to teaching English to international students.
- Students regularly engage with international and American students through classroom activities, conversation partners, and on-and-off-campus events.
- UCA IEP Pathway program: Students who already have some English proficiency (High B-1 to low B-2 in the Common European Framework) may place in UCA'S Intensive English Pathway program in which they can take a limited number of college courses along with their English classes. The Pathway Program is available beginning in Level 3 and continues through Level 5. Final placement in Pathway program is determined upon arrival on campus.



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
