UCA's IEP program is perfect for international undergraduate or graduate students applying for admission to a U.S. college or university who must first improve their language skills or any student who requires or desires further language preparation.

After completing the program, most students begin their academic studies at UCA or other universities and colleges in the United States.

Our Program

- UCA's IEP has six levels of study from beginner to advanced.
- Each level is 8 weeks in length and classes meet 22 hours per week.
- Because each level is 8 weeks long, mid-semester entry is possible.
- Students take a test and are placed at the appropriate level during orientation.
- Students deepen their knowledge of Grammar, Listening & Feaking, Writing, Reading, and Vocabulary.
- No TOEFL score is required to exit the IEP for undergraduate students.
