Credit Requirements	<p>Students are required to take a minimum of 12 credit hours to maintain immigration status, and a maximum of 15 credits are offered per semester. Students will pay tuition for all hours in excess of 15.</p>																					
Transcripts	<p>Upon the completion of the exchange period, official transcripts will be sent to the partner university and to the student.</p>																					
Accommodations	<p>Exchange students are required to live in campus residence halls or apartments. UCA has many options to offer.</p> <p>Shared dorm rooms are common at UCA and most American universities. For more information click here.</p> <p>Exchange students are required to have medical insurance, which must provide the following coverage:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • \$250,000.00 per accident or illness for medical expenses • \$50,000.00 for medical evacuation • \$25,000.00 for repatriation of remains • Maximum \$500 deductible per policy year <p>Exchange students have two options regarding medical insurance:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Complete the process to request official approval for purchasing other insurance coverage that meets required standards. The student exchange waiver for tuition and fees is applied after arrival to campus and within the first few weeks of classes.</p>
Arrival Information	<p>A university shuttle will be available for airport pick-ups and drop-offs at the beginning and end of the semester for stated dates and times. More information will be made available after the student is admitted.</p>
Student Credentials	<p>Upon acceptance to UCA, students will receive login information to their MyUCA account (https://my.uca.edu/) and university email. Students are encouraged to check their UCA email regularly, even prior to arrival.</p> <p>Exchange students will receive a digital UCA Bear Card (university identification card) upon arrival. This student ID will be set up on a mobile device and used to pay for on-campus meals, enter housing and other on-campus buildings, allow the student to attend some programs and sporting events free of charge, give discounts at participating businesses and more.</p>
