F-1 STUDENT REQUEST FOR I-20 EXTENSION

In accordance with the United States Citizenship and Immigration Service (USCIS) regulation 8 C.F.R. § 214.2(f)(7)(iii)-(iv), an international student on an F-1 visa is eligible for an extension of their I-20 program end date under the following circumstances if:

- the student has continually maintained status and
- the delays are caused by **compelling academic or medical reasons**, such as changes of major or research topics, unexpected research problems, or documented illnesses.
- Delays caused by academic probation or suspension are not acceptable reasons for program extensions.
- An extension will not be granted if the student does not apply for an extension before the program end date on their current I-20.

An extension will be granted for a **maximum of one year.** If additional time is needed beyond one year, a new extension request will be required at that time. Applications may be submitted no earlier than 90 days before the program end date of the current I-20.
