<p>Admission Requirements & Language Proficiency</p>	<p>Applicants for the CJS program must meet the following application requirements.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Have completed at least 12 years of formal education or the equivalent, and qualified to enroll at a university. 2. Have a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or better on a 4.0 scale or its equivalent at the most recent level of study. (Exchange students with lower GPA maybe considered.) 3. Have a level of Japanese or English ability sufficient to undergo education at Nanzan University.

<p>Registration Requirements & Placement Test</p>	<p>Students must register 14 – 18 credits for a semester. Students register courses after their Japanese level is confirmed by the Japanese placement test they take after arriving in Japan. All students must take an 8-credit load Japanese language course a semester.</p>



Course Restriction	All courses offered in IJP are open to exchange students. Courses, such as Japanese seminar courses, require certain Japanese language levels, which are decided based on the above-mentioned placement tests, to register. Some courses have enrollment capacity.

	All students receive grades on a letter grade basis with scores out of 100, and it can be changed to pass-failure scale by submitting an application with his/her home institution's permission.			
Transcript of Academic Record	Transcript of Academic Record (an official transcript) is mailed to the exchange student's home institution within one month (or two months) after the end of the semester. NOTE: The transcript does not include GPA.			

ESTIMATED PROGRAM FEES

Tuition & Fees	<p>Tuition, application & admission fees are waived for exchange students. Students should also budget for additional costs such as insurance, security deposit, books and supplies, housing, meals, local transportation, and personal expenses.</p> <p>An invoice will be issued to each student, if not to the home institution, after the acceptance announcement.</p> <p>Payments can be done online, via credit card, or by international wire transfer.</p>
Housing <i>More information about housing can be found here.</i>	<p><ARRANGEMENT></p> <p>Students are required to submit a housing application along with their admission application through the Online Application System. Once admitted, students will be asked to place a Housing Request to indicate their intension to live in a shared type of dormitory or a completely independent studio type of apartment. The final announcement of their housing placement will be made approximately two months prior to the beginning of the semester.</p>

<p>Scholarships</p>	<p>【Hirschmeier Scholarship】</p> <p>¥150,000 / semester</p> <p>Nanzan University awards Hirschmeier Scholarship to CJS students in order to reduce the financial burden and help them successfully complete their intended studies.</p> <p>CJS students may apply for the scholarship after joining the CJS program ONLY. Those students who pass our screening will receive the scholarship in their second semester.</p> <p>The application eligibility, receiving qualifications, and other information will be provided to the enrolled CJS students when it is ready.</p>

【JASSO Scholarship】

¥80,000 / month

The Japan Student Services Organization (JASSO) offers scholarship for qualified international students who are accepted by a Japanese university under a student exchange agreement. JASSO adopts exchange programs carried out by Japanese universities every year and allocates a scholarship quota to each university. Since the quota is different each year and not guaranteed every year, it may be best to confirm on the awarded status if interested.

We will inform our exchange partners when the scholarship may be offered from JASSO. Therefore, students should contact the study abroad office at their home university for the updates.

- All course lists for Spring and Fall semesters will be updated in March. Course offerings and syllabi may vary each year.
- Number of courses conducted in English is limited, except for some university-wide undergraduate courses categorized as "International Course Category." Most courses are mainly taught in Japanese.

Course Offerings and Restrictions

- Exchange students are eligible to enroll in most courses as long as they meet the entry requirements and course is not filled to capacity.
- In general, "Seminars," Language courses, and some compulsory courses for degree students are not available for exchange students. Exceptions may be considered depending on students' academic performance at their home university.
- In principle, graduate students should choose classes offered in graduate courses at Nanzan. Please note that enrollment restrictions for exchange students vary depending on each school.

Registration Requirements

Exchange students must register and attend **more than 10 hours (600 minutes) of classes** per week. It is mandatory to attend at least six periods (100 minutes constitute one period) every week to meet this requirement.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

Course Planning	<p><u>During Fall (September –December)</u></p> <p>Step 1: Consult an Adviser at your home university about appropriate courses for you offered at Nanzan depending on your level of study and experience.</p> <p>Step 2: Contact our Academic Adviser (intl-advising@nanzan-u.ac.jp) to ensure your prior academic experience and language proficiency meet the entry requirements of your desired courses. Students who wish to apply for graduate programs must consult our Academic Adviser to discuss their prospective research Supervisor while at Nanzan.</p>

Language Requirements	<p><u>MINIMUM SCORES TO BE ELIGIBLE</u></p> <p>Opting for courses taught in Japanese: Japanese Language Proficiency Test (JLPT) N2 level</p> <p>Opting for courses taught in English: TOEFL iBT 75 or IELTS 5.5</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">➤ A confirmation letter by a Professor at the home university that indicates the applicant has the proficiency equivalent to that mentioned above can be accepted. In that case, the applicant may be asked to have a zoom interview in order for us to confirm their language proficiency.➤ For English-speaking countries, proof of English language proficiency is not required.



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APPROXIMATE TIMELINE FOR ENROLLMENT (September Entry)

Results Notification Sent by Email (to students and their home university)	Early May Successful applicants will receive the invoice and an “Admission Packet.” The package covers information about the necessary steps to be taken for studying at Nanzan, including the instructions on applying for a student visa.			
Registration for Enrollment	1) Confirmation of Enrollment: Students must submit the designated “Confirmation of Enrollment” by May 31. 2) Complete Payment: Housing fees and additional expenses associated with the exchange (accident insurance, security deposit, etc.) must be paid by June 15. 3) Arrival Information Submission: “Arrival Information” and a travel itinerary must be submitted by June 30.			
Notification of Accommodation	Housing arrangement will be made after the payment is confirmed in June. Students will then receive a notification of the accommodation in mid-July.			
Course Registration	Course registration for exchange students is a specialized process. Students will receive help from our Academic Adviser with instructions and a “Course Request Form” in June. <u>The form must be returned to us by early July.</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Based on the Course Request Form, the Adviser will review your request and transcripts from home university to consider your prior academic experience and check whether seats are open in preferred courses. ➤ Exchange Students will be registered for as many courses as possible among the selected courses before their arrival and will work with the Academic Adviser during the orientation week to finalize the schedule. 			
Visa Application	Early August The official letter of admission and the Certificate of Eligibility (for non-Japanese citizens) required for student visa will be mailed to students.
